DR. BEST IS FOUND DEAD IN HIS OFFICE

Dr. W. E. Best, a well-known physician of Cottage Grove, died suddenly yesterday afternoon of apoplexy in his office, where his body was found at 4 o'clock by Mrs. Jordan, a patient. Coroner W. T. Gordon was called, but as there were no unnatural circumstances, he deemed an inquest unnecessary.

Early in the morning he had felt so well that his wife had gone on a visit into the country. About noon Dr. Macy, a dentist, saw him, and Dr. Best had told him that he thought he was going to die, he had had such a bad spell. At that time, however, he was feeling much better.

From the evidence gathered by Coroner Gordon, Dr. Best had tried to raise himself from his bed and had fallen dead to the floor two hours before his body was found. Three months before Dr. Klime, a Cottage Grove doctor, had treated the physician for heart trouble.

Dr. Best was 65 years old, and is said to have been well off, his property being in the East. He was a retired physician, still practicing when occasion required. He is survived by his wife.
