### GOOD CHANCE FOR NEW MEN ON FOOTBALL TEAM

As only seven of Oregon's first team of last year's football squad are at all likely to come back, and as one or two of these may not be in college, the chance for new men for the first team is better than at any time for two or three years. And as an additional inducement to football material, the coaching here this year is expected to be the best of any institution in the Northwest, for as well as "Bob" Forbes, head coach, other old Yale players will visit the college to give the team pointers.

The freshmen team will also keep a bunch busy to win places, as the schedule is attractive. Then, too, there will be the regular second eleven, which has three or four games each year.

Walter McIntire, the guard who played such brilliant ball last fall, may not put on a gridiron uniform this year, as his return to college is doubtful. This cuts the first eleven men down to six for a nucleus, although there are substitutes and second team men who will make some of the places.

Yet the fact remains that the chance for young athletes on Oregon's gridiron is better than for several seasons. As a rule two or three men from the freshman class make the team. Last year Coleman and Taylor at half were two signal examples. Clark and Moulton also are men who made the first team unqualifiedly in their initiative season. Pinkham and Scott each subbed a season.

While Oregon's coaching should be the best ever seen in the Northwest, the team will have an ideal captain as well. Fred Moulton, even when a freshman, held the team together notably at two or three critical periods in games, and has already shown himself a general and a master of men by jumping into climax with a cool head.

### HORSE DIED OF PNEUMONIA, AND NOT OF GLANDERS

To the Public:—Considerable anxiety having been caused to horse owners by the statement of Dr. Hopkins of this city that a horse owned by Seavey Brothers and working in the Thomsbury hop yard, under circumstances that could expose many other horses, was afflicted with the glanders, we deem it our duty to say to the public that the horse in question was not afflicted with the glanders but had acute pneumonia. We have made an autopsy on the carcass of this horse and know beyond question that such was the case. No owner of horses need feel the least anxiety because his horse came in contact with this one while sick. We further say that the statement of Dr. Hopkins that he has a preventative for horses exposed to glanders is erroneous. There is no such preventative. Glanders when really existing is an incurable disease. It is communicated by inoculation only, and an animal once inoculated can not be saved. Any money paid for an alleged preventative is thrown away. There is but one recognized method of treating glanders, viz: Immediate quarantine of suspected cases and the killing of animals definitely known to have the disease.

### OVER \$40,000 BEING SPENT ON BIBLE SCHOOL

President E. C. Sanderson, of the Bible University, is making improvements at his institution this year that will amount to more than \$40,000. Besides the fine new stone building, which will cost in the neighborhood of \$35,000, there is a heating plant on which about \$5,000 will be expended, and improvements in Rehm hall which will amount to \$1,500 or more.

Rehm Hall, which was named several weeks ago after a benefactor of the school, Mrs. L. E. Rehm, of Helix, a town in Eastern Oregon, is being turned into an up-to-date boarding hall and girls' dormitory. However, the chapel in the building will still be used, as will one class room. The hall will accommodate about 24 girls.

The large stone building is now being prepared for plastering, the outside work being almost completed. The chimney for the heating plant is also being erected.
