## BUILD ROAD TO TALL TIMBER FROM BROWNSVILLE

FINAL SURVEY FOR LINE OF CALAPOOIA RIVER BEING MADE—TALBOT SAID TO BE BEHIND PROJECT—WILL TAP RICH FARMING COUNTRY BESIDES TIMBER.

Albany, Or., July 22.—Final survey of the railroad to be constructed up the Calapoopia river from Brownsville will begin next week. Announcement was made of this fact today by Brownsville men in touch with the promoters of the road. Stakes will be set for grading the line, and this work will begin in the immediate future. Piles of ties have already been placed along the course of the road for several miles.

The survey for the line will follow very closely the preliminary survey made some time ago, and the road will be built a distance of ten miles at first, from Brownsville to a point two and a half miles beyond Crawfordville. It will doubtless be extended later, but the line will be completed and in operation for this distance before any additions are made. The new road will connect with the Southern-Springfield branch of the Western Pacific at a point half a mile south of the Brownsville depot, and will run through the southern portion of Brownsville, and then will follow a direct line through Crawfordville, running all of the time on the south side of the Calapoopia river.

The first ten miles of road must be completed and trains in operation before August 1, 1909, under the terms by which the right-of-way was secured. Deeds for the land through which the railroad will run have been placed in escrow in the Bank of Brownsville, to become the property of the railroad company if the line is in operation by that time. Plans for this new railroad have been discussed for several weeks, but only in the past few days has the definite announcement come that the road is assured. The road has been promoted by J. S. Talbot, of Portland, who successfully promoted the Dallas-Falls City route. Talbot met the preliminary survey for the road and will be the active head of the general survey, which will begin Monday. C. H. Warner, a Portland capitalist, is said to be interested in the road, and it is presumed some Brownsville business men are interested in the enterprise. The new line will tap a big timber belt, in which several small sawmills are already located. It will also run through a good stock and dairying country, and will develop one of the richest portions of the county, so far as natural resources are concerned.

### WHEAT YIELD IN YAMHILL SAID TO BE FLATTERING

McMinnville, Or., July 22.—Prospects for an abundant grain crop in this section are quite flattering. Harvesting operations in progress at the Sheldon farm, seven miles southwest of town, reveal a wheat crop where four grains to the bush are the rule. Threshermen predict that the crop will yield at least 40 bushels to the acre.

H. Brauneman, who has threshed a great many crops in Oregon, says that the oat crop this year is looking better at this time than it has at a corresponding date for the last 14 years. Clover hay has yielded pretty generally three tons to the acre, with a second crop yet to be reckoned on, and the experimental fields of alfalfa have all made good.

## LINN COUNTY ROBBERS COMING SOUTHWARD

Albany, Or., July 22.—Two men answering the description of the Austrian robbers were seen today seven miles south of Lebanon, where they inquired at a farmhouse the distance to the main line of the Southern Pacific. They had evidently come almost to Lebanon and turned southward to avoid the city. If they keep their present course they will strike the railroad near Shedd's this evening. Trains will be watched closely here tonight.

All search for the robbers has been abandoned by the Sweet Home posse, but officers have been notified to watch for them in cities and towns along the railroad.

After the robbers successfully escaped from the battle at Sweet Home early Monday morning the residents of that part of the county have taken little interest in the matter because of the belief that the whole affair was merely some kind of a quarrel among the Austrian laborers. This left the search in the hands of the Austrians and there was no system whatever in guarding the outlet from the hills, so escape was easy.

## DAUGHTER OF GERMAN MAYOR IS BEHEADED

Frisberg, Saxony, July 22.—Grete Beier, the 18-year-old daughter of the mayor of Frisberg, was beheaded last night some time between dark and dawn, in punishment for the murder of the man to whom she was engaged to be married. The executioner reached the city last night. He carried a box containing the ax with which he did his work and brought with him also a suit of evening clothes. The wearing of this garb is an official requirement of the soubre occasion. The preparations for the execution at the prison had been completed, and the man did his work quietly and privately, departing as quietly as he came. The king of Saxony had refused a pardon.

The personality of this young girl and her thoughtfully arranged murder of her fiancée, a civil engineer named Preffler, attracted international attention. The social position of her family was very good, and she became engaged to Preffler, a rich young aristocrat with the utmost simplicity that she visited her fiancée's house one evening, gave him a glass of potassium in a drink she had mixed for him, and then, to make sure of his death, shot him in the mouth with his own revolver.

She then dropped the weapon at the dead man's side, placed a forged will in her own favor on his desk, together with a note of goodbye, also forged, saying that he feared to lose her love through the revelations of a dishonorable liaison.

In addition to these papers, a girl also left behind a package of forged letters—giving a name from a woman in Italy, occasion Preffler of deserting her and threatening to tell Grete everything.
