### SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRAFFIC IS NOW NORMAL

Southern Pacific railroad traffic is normal, according to railroad men in the city. The full number of men has not been put on the runs yet, and no extra trains are being operated, however, because of the heavier motive power being used. The big freight engines are capable of drawing twice as much as the "monkeys" in use two years ago. The moguls of today are capable of hauling a 2000-ton load, and not overstraining, either. Though this is a presidential year, railroad men expect business to increase as the year grows older. Since last fall the transportation business, in common with many other big lines, has taken a decided slump, but during the past month, with a new harvest of fruit and vegetables, and grain in sight, the Southern Pacific traffic is steadily increasing.

### W. HYDE STALKER FINED AT MEDFORD

### UNIVERSITY OF OREGON GRADUATE HAS TROUBLE IN SOUTHERN OREGON CITY

The following from the Medford Mail concerns a graduate of the University of Oregon with the class of 1898:

William Hyde Stalker was yesterday fined \$15 in the court of Justice Cannon in this city for assault and battery upon the person of J. A. Bothwell. Mr. Bothwell was the complaining witness.

Mr. Stalker pleaded guilty and the fine was imposed without a formal trial.

The assault upon Mr. Bothwell took place on Monday in front of the Hotel Nash. Mr. Bothwell is said to have been approached and struck by Mr. Stalker owing to differences arising between the two men over the affairs of the Realty Bond syndicate of Oregon.

After the assault on Monday Mr. Stalker visited the recorder's court and paid a fine of \$10 for disturbing the peace of the city. It was probably due to this fact that he was not more heavily fined in the justice's court.
