REGENTS DO MUCH BUSINESS SATURDAY

SEVERAL LOTS IN FAIRMOUNT ORDERED PURCHASED AND FRAME STRUCTURE TO BE BUILT — CITY SUPERINTENDENT L. R. ALDERMAN WILL BE NEW MEMBER OF FACULTY

The board of regents of the University purchased eight lots in Fairmount, ordered \$10,000 worth of books, ordered the construction of a temporary recitation building on the Mummy lots purchased, ordered President Campbell to go to the East to will vacant places on the teaching staff, and chose a number of instructors for additions to the faculty at its meeting Saturday afternoon, besides attending to sundry other matters.

The lots purchased were Nos. 1, 2, 17 18, 8, 9, 10 and 11, block 1, of Fairmount. The Potter lot just south of the University was also ordered bought. A committee was appointed to inquire into further purchases. On the Mummy lots, the first four numbered, will be erected during August a temporary frame recitation building, to cost about \$5000. This structure will be turned into a shop as soon as the present need is passed.

The Mary Spiller home for girls will be finished and furnished. The clubhouse named after the first woman instructor at the University, that will be generated for it and the president's mansion at an independent building apart from the main source of reports. They include the acquisition of many thousands of dollars for the year. The small homes just east of President Alderman's home will be started.

New Faculty Members
The new members of the faculty will be introduced to the students on Monday, August 3, at 10:00 o'clock. They will be: Mrs. Ella Bennett, assistant dean of women and instructor in English; Miss Martha Dean, assistant instructor in English; Miss Alice M. Clark, assistant instructor in the correspondence school; Dr. H. C. Clark, who retained as an assistant in history and Mrs. Mabel Cooper, in the correspondence school. President Campbell was authorized in advance to fill the following positions on his trip East:

Head of the department of geology, assistant professor in anatomy and zoology, assistant professor in civil engineering, assistant professor in psychology and a librarian.

The matter of authorizing an assistant in the matter of public speaking was deferred to some future time.

Campus Improvements.
The tennis court was ordered moved and a cement sidewalk constructed along East Eleventh street.

President Campbell will probably leave for the East in the next two or three weeks. The next regular meeting of the board of regents is September 8. The various committees will meet whenever necessary during August.
