HEADQUARTERS OF REPUBLICANS IN NEW YORK

New York, August 1—The tenth floor of the big Metropolitan Life building, overlooking Madison Square, presented a scene of activity today. Clothed behind the doors of the inner chamber men were engaged in animated conference. In the ante-rooms the clerks and attendants were suavely granting or denying admission to visitors, and everywhere there were messengers scurrying hither and thither.

The scene was the headquarters of the Republican national committee and the occasion was the first day of business in connection with the Presidential campaign. Many visitors called today but comparatively few were given an audience. The headquarters will not be in shape for real business until next week, when Mr. Hitchcock and his assistants will take off their coats and begin work in earnest.

From the headquarters in the Metropolitan building the Taft campaign will be directed in every detail. Chicago and Cincinnati will be scenes of activity in connection with the Republican campaign, but the New York headquarters will be the fountain-head from which all important orders will be issued and through which all campaign contributions will flow.

The national committee will work in close harmony with the Congressional committee, which is to have its headquarters in the St. James building. The two headquarters have been connected by private wire and it is expected there will be frequent conferences between the members of the two committees. The relations between the two in fact will be far more intimate than was ever the case in any previous campaign.

The headquarters of the national committee are the same as those occupied as local headquarters in the last two national campaigns. But the visitors today found few of the old familiar faces. Chairman Hitchcock has surrounded himself with a clerical force that is almost entirely new to the work. For the most part the clerks and attendants are young men whom Mr. Hitchcock terms "hustlers." The sons and nephews of committeemen and others with a pull are conspicuous by their absence. The committee expects that it will have to get along with a leaner pocketbook than in previous years and as a consequence none but workers will be kept on the payroll at headquarters.

SPRINGFIELD NEWS ITEMS OF INTEREST

H. E. Pitts, proprietor of the Springfield planing mill, when interviewed by a reporter this week in regard to the output of the mill during the past few months, said that the plant was meeting with gratifying success, as they had all the work they could handle. The mill is now employing six men, and as soon as new machinery can be added, the force will be nearly doubled. They have received two large contracts from Eugene, and also one to furnish the mill work for a \$3000 residence being built thirty miles east of Springfield.

The families of B. J. Washburne and J. L. Clark returned last Saturday from Foley Springs, where they had been for a two weeks' outing. We understand that on their return home they had rather an exciting experience, as the stage in which they returned overturned, giving the entire party a good shaking up. Aside from the scare, no serious damage was done.

Irving Christy, J. W. Machen and J. R. Grigas have filed a location on a mining claim which they have named the "Sunset" and is located near Springfield, or in the mining district south of the B-K. mill.

ADMIRAL COWLES IS RETIRED TODAY

Washington, D. C., August 1—Rear Admiral William S. Cowles, the President's brother-in-law, was placed on the retired list of the navy today, having reached the age limit for active service. The command of the crack battleship New Hampshire at the recent international festivities in Quebec has furnished Rear Admiral Cowles with a brilliant and happy close to his naval career, which throughout has been distinguished for efficiency and faithful service.

A native of Connecticut, Rear Admiral Cowles was appointed to the United States Naval Academy from that State and graduated in 1867. He served in the Mediterranean, Pacific, North Atlantic and Asiatic stations



and at the Isthmus of Panama, attaining his first command as captain in 1902. From 1893 to 1897 he was naval attaché at the United States embassy in London, from 1897 to 1903 he was naval aid to the President, and from 1903 to 1905 he commanded the battleship Missouri. During the past two years he has been chief of the bureau of equipment.

PYTHIAN KNIGHTS INVADE BOSTON IN FULL FORCE

Boston, Mass., August 1—Boston has capitulated to an invading force of 16,000 uniformed Knights of Pythias, who came gathered here for the twenty-fifth biennial national encampment of the order. Arrangements for the entertainment of the thousands of visitors have been in progress for months past and today the finishing touches were given to the programme. The entire business district of the city is gayly decorated with the national colors and the emblems of the order. The decorations of some of the big business houses on Washington, Tremont and Boylston streets are especially elaborate and elicited much praise from the arrivals today.

The visiting Knights will be quartered in 2,000 tents which have been erected on Franklin Field. The camp has been named after one of the great departed Pythian leaders, Joseph H. Lyon. The "tented city" covers seventy-seven acres of the big public playground, with the usual "square" in the centre and a main street down the middle. For convention meetings, a main tent has been erected, and, in addition, dining tents, with running water in each. There also will be large reception and hospital tents, with a corps of physicians and nurses constantly in attendance.

Two great parades will be the spectacular features of the week. One will be held Tuesday, when 10,000 uniformed men will be in line in the Uniform Rank parade. On the following day will take place the parade of the subordinate lodges, with 18,000 members of the order marching.

Following the second parade the drill competition in camp will begin and continue morning and afternoon Thursday and Friday. On Wednesday evening there will be a reception by the supreme lodge to all members of the order in Mechanics' Hall. The programme of the encampment will continue until Tuesday, August 11, when it will be brought to a close with a banquet to the supreme lodge members and their ladies at the Hotel Somerset.

SAVE MRS. FARMER FROM DEATH CHAIR

Auburn, N. Y., August 1—Mrs. Mary Farmer, the condemned murderer of Mrs. Sarah Brennan of Brownville, is under sentence to die in the electric chair at the state prison here next week, but steps taken by her counsel looking to another trial will serve to prevent the sentence being carried out at the present time. The prevailing impression is that the sentence ultimately will be commuted to one of life imprisonment. The woman herself, has displayed little emotion since her conviction and appears to be indifferent to her fate.

Mrs. Farmer's crime was one of the most fiendish in the criminal annals of northern New York. Her victim, who was 55 years old, was her neighbor and intimate friend and the motive was to gain possession of the Brennan home, deeds of which Mrs. Farmer had forged. Mrs. Brennan was hacked to pieces and her body stuffed in a trunk. Mrs. Farmer's husband is also under indictment on a charge of murder in the first degree as accessory to the crime.
