Scoring of Nations. In all the events concluded since the Olympic games began early in the polo and other sports in which England alone competed, the present standing of the countries, counting wins only, is as follows:

United Kingdom, 38; America, 22; Sweden, 7; France, 4; Hungary, 3; Norway, Germany, Canada, Italy, 2 each; Belgium, South Africa, Finland, 1 each.

Track and Field Events. In the field and track events in which the points are counted five for first, three for second and one for third, the standing is:

America, 114 1/2; United Kingdom, 66 1-3; Sweden, 12 1/2; Canada, 11; South Africa and Greece, 8 each; Norway and Germany 4; Italy 3; Hungary, 2 1-3; France, 2 1-3; Australia and Finland, 1 each.

America's score in the field and track events is made up of 15 firsts, 10 seconds, 8 thirds, in addition to a tie for second and third in the standing high jump and a tie for third place in the pole vault.

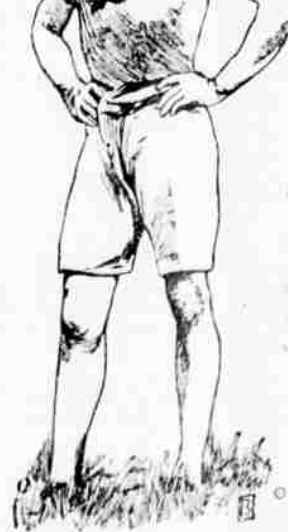
