WANTS TO DIE THAT FOLKS MAY LIVE

HOTEL PORTER WRITES NOTE THAT HE HAS COMMITTED SUICIDE, BUT HE DIDN'T

Charles Roberts, who has been doing porter work around one of the Eugene hotels for several weeks past, wrote the following note last night to his employer:
"Will you please notify my sister, Mrs. Annie Roscher, 10 Cooper street, Brooklyn, N. Y., that I am no longer working here. I have committed suicide. I die so they may live."
"Paul K. Alias Chas. Roberts."

Some apprehension was felt last that he had drunk three-quarters of a gallon of lemon extract this morning, and that not being strong enough to satisfy him he went to the pantry of the hotel and poured a lot of ginger into the mixture that he had made of the lemon extract and a number of other things usually found at blind pigs. He was found at the depot when the noon train arrived today and he told the landlord of the hotel that he was going to Salem. His sister in Brooklyn will not be pained yet awhile with any messages that he has shuffled off this mortal coil.

Politics and Politicians

Charles N. Haskell, the new treasurer of the Democratic national committee, bears the distinction of being the first Governor of Oklahoma. He was chairman of the important committee on resolutions at the recent Denver convention. Early in life he was engaged in railroad construction work.

Colonel Frank L. Smith, who is a candidate for the Republican nomination for lieutenant-governor of Illinois, has sent an appeal to every voter in the State by the name of Smith, asking for his support in the general primary which is to be held next Saturday.

President Gompers of the American Federation of Labor, it is said, is exerting all his influence to induce the members of the Farmer's Educational and co-operative Union to support Mr. Bryan for President. The union is said to have a membership of almost 2,000,000 throughout the country.

Urey Woodson, who has been re-elected to his position of secretary of the Democratic national committee, is a Kentucky journalist, being editor and publishers of newspapers in Paducah and Owensboro. He was railroad commissioner of Kentucky from 1891 to 1896, and has been a member of the Democratic national committee since 1896.

Among those mentioned on the Republican side to succeed United States Senator Stone of Missouri are Col. Richard C. Kerens, one of the veteran leaders of the party in Missouri; Lieutenant Governor McKinley former National Committeeman Thomas J. Akins, State Chairman Walter S. Diekey, and Joseph Black of Richmond.

The national committee of the Socialist party is reported to be hard put to find the wherewithal to conduct the coming campaign. It is desired to send Eugene V. Debs, the candidate for President, on an extensive tour of the country in a special train, but the subscriptions to the fund to be used for this purpose are said to have fallen short of expectations.

The Republican State convention in New York to nominate a candidate for governor will be held in Saratoga, probably the second week of September.

The prohibition party's notification meeting, at which Eugene W. Chaffin, the nominee for the Presidency, will be officially notified of his nomination, will be held in Chicago August 15.
Second Assistant Postmaster-General McClary expects to receive the Republican nomination for Congress in the Second Minnesota District at the primaries to be held September 15.
United States District Attorney Harry Skinner, who is famous for his ability as an orator, may be honored with the Republican nomination for governor of North Carolina when the

State convention meets at Charlotte on August 26.

A recent election in Georgetown, which is located in the heart of the distillate district of central Kentucky, was carried by the anti-prohibition element by the extremely narrow majority of one vote. The contest was a most exciting one.

The carnation is the favorite flower of Judge Taft, as it also was of the late President McKinley. But while the latter favored the red carnation Judge Taft prefers the white variety of the popular flower.

It is estimated that 20,000 Jewish voters will not take part in the state primary in Illinois next Saturday because it is held on their Sabbath. Whether this loss will be an injury to the Republican or Democratic candidates is a matter of conjecture.
