The San Francisco and Oakland teams in the California State League are outclassed. San Francisco won but 5 out of 19 games played and Oakland 2 out of 23.

The South Atlantic League never has had such a one-sided pennant race as this year. Jacksonville is leading, 200 points ahead of Savannah, which team is 100 points ahead of Columbia.

The race in the Northwest League has been a big surprise this season. Seattle, always a contender for the flag in past years, is falling the bunch, while Vancouver, considered an outsider, is going rapidly forward.

Extra inning games must come in St. Louis, the same in New York, a seventeen-inning affair at Albany, twelve innings at Lowell, 12 innings at Montreal, 10 innings at Toronto and ten innings at Rochester, all comprised in the record for one day.

### PYTHIAN DRILLS BEGIN AT BOSTON

Boston, Mass., Aug. 5.—This was another busy and interesting day for the tens of thousands of Pythian Knights in attendance at the annual national encampment of the order. The event of the forenoon was a parade of the subordinate lodges, made up of 10,000 marchers, a score of bands and a number of handsome floats.

The competitive drills began this afternoon at Camp Joseph H. Lyon, and will continue over tomorrow. Liberal prizes will be awarded to the winning competitors, who have entered from all parts of the country.

### SPECTACULAR SUICIDE OF OREGON CITY FARMER

Oregon City, Aug. 4.—Nelse Bodine, a farmer residing near Boring, committed suicide about 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon by dynamiting himself.

He was blasting stumps in a field close to his dwelling, and his last act was to wave his hand to his daughter, who was standing in front of the house, and shout "good-bye."

The explosion followed immediately, blowing him into atoms, a portion of the head, shoulders and arm being all that could be found.

He apparently sat down on a stick of dynamite, connected with a fuse, and then applied a match to the fuse.

No known motive existed, the family asserts, for his sudden self-destruction.
