"AFFINITY" PASTOR TO BE RELEASED FROM PRISON

Trenton, N. J., Aug. 13.—At 8 o'clock tomorrow morning the doors of the state prison of New Jersey will swing open and J. Frank Cordova, the unfringed South River pastor, will step forth a free man, after having served three years, four months and eleven days as a result of his mistaken views on the subject of affinity.

It was about four years ago that the case of Cordova filled columns of newspaper space from one end of the country to the other. It was the original "affinity" case, antedating by several years the equally famous case of Artist Earle. Both were cases of talented and respected men who found their alleged affinities outside their own households, but in their developments and climaxes the two cases differed widely. In the case of Earle the wife acquiesced in the new order of things, and submissively and even gladly made way for the affinity. But with Pastor Cordova things did not work out so smoothly. His wife, the mother of several little children, could not comprehend the fine points of the affinity creed. In her eyes it was a plain case of unfaithfulness on the part of her lord and master and a case calling for the action of the law when her own tearful pleadings failed to convince the pastor of the error of his ways. And more unfortunately still for the guilty husband, the wife of the domestic drama was laid in New Jersey, where the arm of the law is long and lets no guilty offender escape.

The affinity in the Cordova case was Miss Julia Bowen, who belonged to a respectable family in South River. She was a choir singer in the church of which Cordova was the pastor, and it was there held in high esteem by the little flock. But in the course of time the fondness of the pastor for the pretty young choir singer became so apparent as to cause comment. Some of the leaders of the church dropped subtle hints to the pastor reminding him of his indiscretion. But the hints remained unheeded and the congregation was forced to the conclusion that the pastor and singer were guilty of more than indiscretion. The result of it all was that Cordova was removed from his pulpit and Miss Bowen no longer sang in the choir.

There still remained a chance for Cordova to redeem himself, but the "affinity" creed had taken its strong hold of him. One day he and Miss Bowen disappeared from the village, the pastor leaving his wife and children destitute. He was found by a few friends who still stood by him and persuaded to return to his forsaking wife. But it was not long an-

til the couple again eloped, and this time all trace of them was lost for weeks. Neighbors cared for the deserted family, while the officers of the law sought the guilty couple. Finally they were found in an obscure hotel in New York City. The girl was in a delicate condition. Cordova was given the alternative of leaving his affinity forever and returning to his family or to face imprisonment for his misdeeds. He chose the latter course. After a short but sensational trial he was found guilty and sentenced to five years in prison. This term, less the period taken off for good conduct, will end tomorrow morning.

According to reports Cordova expects to make Newark his future home. Miss Bowen, it is said, is awaiting for him in retirement with her child at Ocean Grove. That she will immediately rejoin him seems certain. Cordova refuses to discuss the matter, but says he expects now to be "happy."

ACTION TAKEN BY ADVOCATES OF GOOD ROADS

Portland, Aug. 12.—Education of Oregon people to the value of practical road construction was inaugurated yesterday in the plan endorsed by Tuesday's good roads conference. John H. Scott, ex-county judge of Marion county, and president of the Oregon Good Roads Association, contracted his services to the committee on ways and means, appointed by the conference to direct this work, and has volunteered to raise \$10,000 to defray the cost of this popular education. Immediately he will enter the field and organize road construction in the various counties on a systematic basis. L. R. Webster, judge of Multnomah county, who was appointed by the good roads conference to act in conjunction with Mr. Scott, has not decided to accept the position. To do so would involve his resignation as county judge, and the probable action of Judge Webster is said to depend entirely upon the inducements that are offered him by the good roads advocates.

RAIN CLEAR AIR OF DENSE SMOKE

The light showers yesterday increased into a steady Oregon mist late yesterday afternoon, and it continued to fall during the evening and night. The rain was general along the coast, and had the effect to put out the numerous forest fires which have caused the atmosphere to be so smoky during the last few weeks. The rain has delayed harvest for a day or so, but it is likely that clear weather will prevail after today.
