

### S. P. COMPANY WILL ACCEPT NEW LUMBER RATES

Pending a final decision by the United States supreme court, in the lumber rate controversy, the Harriman officials have announced that the rates fixed by the Interstate Commerce Commission will prevail. This amounts to a victory for the Oregon and Washington lumbermen, since the decision of the commission virtually restored the tariffs that were in effect prior to November 1, 1907. Following the ruling of the commission the railroads appealed the case to the supreme court of the United States.

This announcement was made Saturday by W. E. Coman, assistant general freight agent for the Harriman lines in the Northwest, in the following form: "The rates from November 1, 1907, to October 15, 1908, on shipments from parties to the injunction suit will be the rates as ordered by the commission, which will be published effective October 15. "The rate on shipments on and after October 15 will be the commission's rates as published, regardless of what the final outcome is in the court up to the time of the decision of the supreme court."

### R. SHELLY WILL BUILD ZUBER BLOCK

The contract for W. E. Zuber's new brick, next to the Chrisman block, was let today to R. Shelly, a new contractor, just from Philadelphia. The interior of the building will be 40x120 feet. The building will have to be ready for occupation by October 1, as it is rented to a man by the name of Triplett for a dry goods store, handling ladies' goods as a specialty. The contract price is about \$5200. The specifications call for a building with foundations equal to supporting a two-story structure, though the present plan is to build only one story. The object is to be able to extend it higher if so desired.

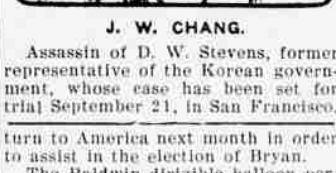
