Petitions of remonstrance against the granting of the Mount Scott district to the new water company formed by B. S. Kelsey are in circulation among the residents of the Mount Scott territory. These petitions will be presented to the county court, asking the court to postpone the hearing of the petition from Monday until such time as the Mount Scott people can investigate the new company thoroughly.

gon, the secretary of state is the successor of the governor when the latter dies, resigns or leaves the office. This is of especial importance when or is remembered that George E. Chamberlain, the governor, has received the popular vote for United States senator, and a majority of the members of the legislature are pledged to elect Chamberlain to the senate. If the legislature elects Governor Chamberlain to the senate to succeed Charles W. Fulton, the secretary of state will become acting governor until the following general election, giving the secretary of state the powers of governor and secretary and the salaries of both offices. The election of Chamberlain would make Benson the acting governor and give him two or three votes in the state board meeting, which means almost absolute control of the political patronage of the state institutions and various sundry appointments.
