EUGENE HAS OPPORTUNITY TO HOLD TERRITORY

CESSATION IN LUMBERING INDUSTRY TURNS CARVER ROAD THIS WAY—BIG DEVELOPMENT CERTAIN IN WESTERN LANE, BENEFIT OF WHICH MAY GO TO CORVALLIS

Explanation of the report that Carver's railroad wants to come to Eugene lies in the present condition of the timber business, say men who ought to know something of the status of the industry. Carver, it is thought, expected that a line to the timber would add a steady source of income when he first began its construction, and felt as soon as he reached the green timber belt that extension and operation would be easy. Now, however, that the lumber industry is at a practical standstill, nobody knows for how long, the hope of immediate freight traffic has fallen through and he is looking for another field.

This field lies in Eugene, which is the centre of the upper Willamette valley. By connecting with this city the promoter not only stands a show of getting a share of considerable carrying trade through an untouched section of the Willamette valley, but of making connections with local freight traffic which will originate with the building of an electric line up the McKenzie.

Not only does it seem the intention of the Corvallis & Alsea to come to Eugene, but also later, when means are available, to go to the Siuslaw and connect this portion of the interior with the coast and therefore cheaper rates.

Corvallis is not a good terminus for such a route, for the Yaquina road runs from there to Yaquina bay, causing too much competition for the new line. Eugene, therefore, seems a much more favorable point to outside observers, who have recently studied the situation.

Good Development

Even if the road were owned by the Southern Pacific, and there is nothing to indicate that it is, the construction of such a line would be of immense value to the county, for in Western Lane there are large resources which can be made to contribute to the upbuilding of Eugene. As the route for the Carver line has been mapped out, Eugene has been threatened with a loss of trade, not only in the foothills of the Coast range, but in the Siuslaw valley itself.

With the building of any kind of a road to the timber belt mills would spring up, as they have in other parts of Lane county, when transportation facilities have been afforded, adding thousands of men to the wealth-producing population. This development is bound to come, the only remaining question being which town will get the benefit, Corvallis or Eugene?

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the terms of Ordinance No. 778, passed by the Common Council of the City of Eugene, August 13, 1908, bids will be received by the street committee of the Council in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Eugene until 7:30 o'clock p. m., Monday August 31st, 1908, for the improvement of Eighth street from the East side of Charnelton street to the West side of Monroe street in the City of Eugene, by the construction of cement curbing along both sides of said street and by paving the same between said points with bitulithic, asphalt, or other hard surface pavement in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor now on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Bidders are required to state the price in detail in accordance with the specifications, and on the form prepared by the City Engineer. Separate contracts will be awarded to the lowest bidder for the construction of said curbing; for the paving and for the drainage. The said improvements shall be completed within ninety days from the date of letting the contract therefor.

The work to be done under the supervision of the Street Committee and to be approved by them. An approved bond will be required of each contractor for the faithful performance of the contract. A certified check in a sum equal to five per cent of the amount bid, payable to J. D. Matlock, Mayor, is required to accompany each bid. The Street Committee reserves the right to reject any or all bids, by order of the Common Council.
