## WOOL GROWERS MEET

### IN ZION CITY

Salt Lake City, Aug. 25.—Plans to break up the "wool trust" will form the principal topic of discussion at the annual convention of the National Wool Growers Association, which convened here today for a three days' session. Many leading wool growers are in attendance from Wyoming, Colorado, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Arizona, Montana, Idaho and other states and territories.

The growers believe that the problem of giving their control of the industry and eliminating the middleman and speculator can be solved by the establishment of storage warehouses in the chief wool-growing centers. This plan has been placed in operation on a small scale in St. Paul and Omaha and the results have been highly satisfactory. It is now proposed to inaugurate the scheme on a large scale, with the establishment of large storage plants in Chicago, Denver, Omaha, Kansas City, Minneapolis and other market centers. A committee of the association has been investigating the subject for several months past and will report the results of its labors to the present convention.

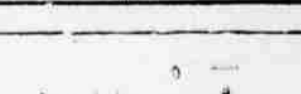
