OSBURNS BUY LOT FOR A FINE HOTEL BUILDING

BANGS RESIDENCE PROPERTY AT EAST EIGHTH AND PEARL SECURED FOR \$15,000—HAS A FRONTAGE OF 114 FEET ON EIGHTH AND 160 FEET ON PEARL.

Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Osburn, who conduct the Hoffman House, today purchased of Eli Bangs the residence property on the northeast corner of East Eighth and Pearl streets and will build a fine hotel there some time in the future. The purchase price is \$15,000.

This is a splendid location for a hotel, and Mr. and Mrs. Osburn have been endeavoring to secure the lot for that purpose for the past year and a half. The lot has a frontage of 114 feet on East Eighth street and 160 feet on Pearl. They will make the hotel one of the finest on the coast, with all modern appointments, and will be one of which Eugene will be proud. It is not stated just when the building will be erected, but it is probable that it will be some time next year.

MINISTER WU TALKED TOO MUCH

Pekin, Aug. 31.—The Chinese government is considering the recall of Wu Tung Fang, minister to Washington, on account of recent disclosures on his part believed to have been indiscreet.

Washington, Aug. 31.—Minister Wu said he had heard nothing about his being recalled, and smilingly added that he did not care if he was. He said his only indiscreet speeches or interviews were some he never made or gave out. He understands that some Japanese papers have stated he has been indiscreet, and should be recalled.

If he is recalled Wu's retirement will cause regret and surprise on part of the American government.

The only prospect for a settlement lies in President Lewis, of the Mine workers who has made no reply to the telegram of the operators charging the miners with having broken faith and asking further consideration before a strike is called.
