CITY COUNCIL HAS VERY BUSY SESSION

Jefferson by grading and graveling the same was passed.

An ordinance for paving the alley between Sixth and Seventh streets reaching from Willamette street east 160 feet was passed.

An ordinance to pave East Seventh street from Oak to High was passed.

The argument for the vote on the \$500,000 water bonds to be printed in pamphlet form and to be distributed before the election was read and adopted.

The question of reserving the use of one of the county parks for ladies, ladies with gentlemen escorts, and families, barring men alone, was discussed. A motion to instruct the city attorney to prepare an ordinance on the same was lost.

The eighty per cent (\$22,899.50) on the paving of Olive street and Oak street was ordered paid by city warrants.

The bill of \$1900 of McClain & McArthur for engineering services was taken up and referred to the fire and water committee and city attorney to investigate, and if under the contract they are entitled to the money the bill should be paid.

The bill of Mr. Kennerly for meals served the councilmen and others who went to Ritehey creek was ordered paid.

The council then adjourned until Wednesday at 4:30 p. m.

DIED.

John Currin, 92 years of age, a highly respected citizen of south Lane county, died at his home at Cottage Grove at 2 o'clock Sunday of old age. Uncle John, as he was familiarly known, was born in Grayson county, Virginia, March 16, 1816, and moved to Missouri in 1841, where he was married to Miss Margaret Swift in 1843, crossing the plains to Oregon with an ox team in 1853.

He settled on his homestead three miles east of Cottage Grove, where he and his highly esteemed wife, Aunt Margaret, 90 years old, who survives him, have resided continuously since.

There were born to them seven children, all of whom are dead except Felix S., with whom they have made their home of late years.

At the Eugene hospital today, Henry Pfeiffer, aged 64 years, from apoplexy. He had been working on a farm on the McKenzie six or eight miles northeast of Eugene when he was suddenly taken ill about a week ago. He was brought to the hospital and remained in an unconscious condition until his death. Little is known of him here.
