## SEPTEMBER WEATHER AVERAGES FOR 36 YEARS

September, with its Indian summer and pleasant, ripening days, arrived today. That this description is not amiss will be seen by an inspection of the data of the Oregon weather bureau for the last 36 years, showing temperature, precipitation and general conditions. While the government forecaster is careful to announce that these statistics cannot be construed as a forecast as to how the weather will behave during the present month, it may afford several grains of comfort to overworked mortals who have yet to flounce on their vacation time.

The average rainfall in September for the 36-year period is 1.78 inches. The average number of days on which one-tenth of an inch or more of water fell is only eight. The greatest rainfall for the month was in 1884, when 4.5 inches were recorded. To balance against this, there was no rain whatever in September, 1873. There has been an average of 12 clear days, 19 partly cloudy days, and eight cloudy. Prevailing winds are northwest, with an average velocity of five miles an hour, and the heaviest wind came in 1897, when the speed went to 43 miles an hour.

The year 1888 furnished the warmest September, with an average of 66 degrees. The coldest average was in 1895, at 57 degrees. The hottest September days were recorded in 1886, and again last year, when the thermometer climbed to 93. In 1895 it went for one day to the chilling tune of 36 degrees. The earliest date for killing frost in autumn is October 13, but the average date is November 16.

## BUSY DAY FOR GRIZZLED VETERANS OF CIVIL WAR

Toledo, O., Sept. 1.—Veterans and other visitors attending the national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic this morning to find before them a program of business and pleasure calculated to keep them exceedingly busy during the entire day. The events of encampment week were inaugurated in earnest this forenoon with reunion of many regiments and regiments and meetings of committees of the several auxiliary organizations to complete reports to be presented to the annual meetings to be held during the next few days.

The big event of today's program, of interest to the general public as well as the veterans, was the dedication of the monument on the site of Ft. Meigs, at Perrysburg, within easy access of this city by trolley car and boat. The monument marks the place where General William Henry Harrison defeated Proctor, the British general, and Tecumseh, the Indian ally, in 1813, and saved all the western territory to the United States. The dedication was accompanied by interesting exercises which were participated in by the national and state officials of the G. A. R., the Ohio National Guard, and the chief executives of Ohio, Virginia, Kentucky and several other states.

Everything is in readiness for the formal opening of the encampment tonight at the Valentine Theatre, where a big campfire will be lighted. Governor Harris of Ohio, Mayor Whitlock of Toledo, Department Commander Shearer of the Ohio G. A. R., and J. Kent Hamilton, chairman of the local executive committee, will extend greetings, and the invocation will be by Rt. Rev. Samuel Fallows, chaplain-in-chief. Judge Charles G. Burton of Missouri, commander-in-chief, will respond, after which Mrs. Kate F. Jones of New York, national president of the W. R. C., will extend greetings for the order. Other speakers of the evening will be Dr. Ralph Sheldon, of Albany, N. Y., commander-in-chief of the Sons of Veterans; Miss C. Millie Leighton, of Massachusetts, national president of the Daughters of Veterans; Judge Advocate General L. W. Collins, of Minnesota; Mrs. Clara N. Sawyer of Portland, Me., representing the Ladies of the G. A. R.; Judge L. E. Griffith, senior vice commander-in-chief, and W. H. Scott, the junior vice commander-in-chief. One of the impressive features of the campfire, aside from the speeches and the singing by the Toledo Mannerchor, will be the flag presentation by the Army Nurses.
