### SAYS HUSBAND LOVES ANOTHER WOMAN

**MRS. ANNA JAMES SEEKS LEGAL SEPARATION FROM HENRY JAMES AFTER TWENTY YEARS OF WEDDED LIFE**

Mrs. Anna James, of Cottage Grove, today began suit in the circuit court against her husband, Henry James. In her complaint, filed this afternoon by her attorney, L. M. Travis, she says that they were married in Eugene on March 10, 1888, and have the following children: George, aged 19; William, aged 17; Dora, aged 14; and Clarence, aged 12; all residing at Saginaw. Mrs. James avers that a year ago her spouse struck her with his fist and that he brought to their house one Nan Bennett, whom he said he loved

better than he did his wife, and continued to keep her there; that in August, 1907, he drove his wife from the house and told her never to return. Since then, she says, she has been working at cooking and house-keeping to support herself, her husband refusing to provide anything for maintenance.

### BRADY NOMINATED, BUT FRENCH WAS BEATEN BY HAMER

Boise, Idaho, Sept. 2.—The republican state convention gave Idaho its biggest political surprise when at the eleventh hour it defeated the state ticket agreed on by Chairman Brady, the nominee for governor. The opposition led by George W. Thompson of Nez Perce county put through a deal that upset all calculations, and defeated the one man who was regarded as having clear sailing. Congressman French was defeated for the nomination by Colonel Thomas R. Hamer, of Idaho Falls, although French had been slated to win.

Following is the ticket: United States senator, Weldon B. Heyburn of Shoshone; congressman, Thomas R. Hamer, Fremont; governor, James H. Brady, of Bannock; lieutenant governor, L. H. Sweetzer, of Cassia; secretary of state, Robert Landson, of Washington; attorney general, D. C. McDougall of Oneida; auditor, S. Taylor of Bonner; treasurer, S. A. Hastings, of Nez Perce; mine inspector, F. C. Moore of Shoshone; superintendent of public instruction, S. Belle Chamberlain; presidential electors, Edgar Wilson, of Ada; John Lamb, of Owyhee, and A. A. Crane of Kootenai.
