## SHRINERS LOUD IN THEIR PRAISE OF EUGENE

The Shriners returned from Eugene yesterday with enthusiastic praise for Eugene, says the Journal. From the moment of the arrival of the Portland special in the college town, at noon Saturday, until the time of its departure Sunday morning, the visitors were treated with every courtesy and the warmest hospitality, so that a general vote of thanks and appreciation were passed.  
"A beautiful little town" every one pronounced it. Automobiles were kept busy all day showing the visitors about.  
The objective point was the state university, and the visitors went through the buildings in crowds, and expressed openly their surprise at the extent of work shown there. They were pleased with the improvements which have been set on foot there since the lifting of the referendum on the University appropriation. Inspectors and students were in the various departments to show the visitors about, since the fall work will not begin for two or three weeks.  
Pity the Victims  
Dr. Homer I. Keeney was one of the Portland visitors, and he expressed his unbounded delight on learning that Professor John Straub, of the Greek department, was to be one of the initiates. "I have been waiting for ten years to get even," said the doctor delightedly, with sad reminiscences of his Greek verbs when he was a student at the University of Oregon. And it is whispered that the young doctor lost no chances. Judge Lawrence T. Harris, circuit judge for the Second district, came in for his share of honors, and Dr. Littlefield, of Newburg, and Dr. Davis, of Albany, were also marked men. A number of the candidates went up on the special and life was made a burden to them.  
There were 208 Shriners who left Portland Saturday morning, and 50 were picked up en route to Eugene. The day was full of excitement, with sightseeing throughout the day, the parade at 1 o'clock, following a business meeting, and the initiation in the evening from 8 to 11, when a banquet was served in a neighboring hall during most of the night. This special dispensation meeting was so successful and so much enjoyed that the Shriners are planning another for Asbland in about two months.

**FOR PURE FOODS AND DRUGS AT GENEVA**  
Geneva, Sept. 8.—The United States is to have a conspicuous part in the deliberations of the first international congress for the repression of the adulteration of alimentary and pharmaceutical products, which convened in Geneva today for a week's session. The congress is held under the auspices of the White Cross association, which is intended to be complementary to the Red Cross Society.  
Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, chief of the bureau of chemistry of the Department of Agriculture, heads the official delegation from the United States. Reports of Dr. Wiley's scientific experiments to determine the relative values of articles of food and drink had preceded him and at the opening of the congress today he was one of the most prominent figures. Dr. Wiley will present three papers to the congress. These will deal with the purpose and working of the Food and Drug Act, the advisability of excluding chemical preservatives from all food products, and the importance of securing, through an international congress, uniformity in definition of adulterations of foods and drugs.
