ELECTRICAL STORM PLAYS HAVOC AT SAGINAW

LIGHTNING STRIKES BOARDING HOUSE AND OTHER BUILDINGS—RENTERS EVERY TELEPHONE IN LYNX HOLLOW USELESS AND MELTS WIRES

The territory in and around Saginaw was subjected to the most destructive electrical storm remembered by the oldest inhabitant last Sunday. The bolts of lightning played havoc with the telephone lines, trees and buildings. Up at Lynx Hollow every telephone was knocked out of commission, and in many cases torn from the walls and destroyed. The insulated wires melted and ran out. The first place to receive damage from this storm was the Saginaw boarding house. Fortunately this was not occupied at the time or most disastrous results might have happened, possibly loss of life. A bolt of lightning struck the side of the roof, making a small hole, going completely through the structure, demolishing the interior and making a huge hole at least ten feet in diameter in the side of the building. The telephone was wrecked, being torn from the wall, and everything metallic melted beyond recognition. It is at this place, it is thought, the lightning followed the wires on its course of ruin.

The next place visited was that of J. F. Neet, where the "juice" tore off a couple of boards from the house, burning out the phone, and jumped to the local telegraph wires leading to the home of C. J. Queen. Here it followed the wires across the woodwork, tearing off several boards. Two poles were shattered, and thus the lightning went on its course up Lynx Hollow, hurling great trees to the ground in splinters and destroying telephones. Other houses were struck but with little damage. The lightning was accompanied with reports like that of a pistol, and a number of the inhabitants were badly frightened. Ed Queen had a telegraph instrument which was pretty well melted as a result of the electrical visit. This was without doubt the worst storm that section has ever had, and none are hankering after another such experience.—Cottage Grove Western Oregon.

NEGRO MASONS HOLD CENTENARY CELEBRATION

Boston, Mass., Sept. 10.—A four days' celebration was inaugurated in Boston today in observance of the centennial anniversary of the institution of the first grand lodge of colored Masons in America. Nearly all of the 42 colored grand lodges of regular Masons in the United States and Canada have sent representatives to the celebration, which is being conducted under the direction of the Prince Hall grand lodge, F. & A. M., of Massachusetts.

A parade of blue lodge Masons preceded the opening of the anniversary exercises in Symphony Hall this afternoon. The exercises were of a historical character and included the reading of the original warrant 459 from the grand lodge of England, which is the foundation of authority upon which the order in the United States stands. The chief feature of the exercises, however, was an oration by ex-Representative William L. Reed, a past grand master of the Prince Hall grand lodge.

Though the first grand lodge of negro Masons dates from 1808 there were subordinate lodges among the negro residents of Boston and vicinity many years before that time. In 1775, Prince Hall, then 27 years of age, wended his way to the quarters of General Gage on Copp's Hill to become a Mason. In British lodge 58 he was raised to the degree of Master Mason—the first man of African descent to be initiated into the order in the American colonies. On March 6 Prince Hall and 14 other negroes were authorized to work under dispensation until they were authorized by charter.

Prince Hall was not content with the limited powers contained in the dispensation from the army lodge. He petitioned General Joseph Warren for a charter. His request was entertained, but before action could be taken Warren fell at Bunker Hill. Hall then applied to the provincial grand master of modern Masons of Massachusetts for a charter. This petition was rejected on account of his color.

Prince Hall and his followers decided to make application for dispensation for that which had been refused them at home. On March 2, 1784, he asked the grand lodge of England for a warrant of constitution. The warrant was granted September 29, 1784.

In 1787 Captain James Scott, who married the sister of the celebrated John Hancock, was requested by Prince Hall to bring the warrant for African lodge back with him. In April of the same year Captain Scott delivered the warrant in person to Prince Hall.

The lodge of negroes celebrated with great pomp the arrival of its warrant from England on December 27, 1787. The organization of the first lodge was followed by the formation of two other lodges of negro Masons. In 1808 the three lodges joined in forming "African grand lodge" of Boston—subsequently styled Prince Hall grand lodge of Massachusetts.
