## METHODISTS CLOSE ANOTHER SPLENDID YEAR

GAIN OF FIFTY PER CENT IN MEMBERSHIP IN LAST TWO YEARS—MORE MONEY RAISED FOR DIFFERENT PURPOSES THAN FOR ANY YEAR IN HISTORY OF CHURCH.

Last night the fourth quarterly conference of Humphrey Memorial Methodist Episcopal church was held in the main auditorium of the church. The reports from all departments indicated that the church has had another phenomenal year. The church is steadily growing in members and in influence in the community. Since the coming of the present pastor, Rev. D. H. Trimble, less than two years ago, more than 550 persons have united with the church. The pastor's report showed that after allowing for removals by letter, loss by death and applying the disciplinary rule of marking those removed a year without letter as removed, that the church has made a net gain of over 50 per cent in membership in the two years just closing.

The money raised for local church expenses, such as pastor's salary, deaconess, music, janitor, etc., will exceed by \$2000 last year's record, which was till then the highest mark the church had reached. The sum reached for local church expense will total about \$5,700 this year. In addition to this the Ladies' Aid will raise upwards of \$500 during the year.

The benevolences of the church will also reach and probably pass last year's high mark. On the whole it has been the best year in the history of the church, and everybody connected with the church is happy over the vital and growing condition of the organization.

The pastor and deaconess received a hearty and unanimous invitation to return for another year, and resolutions are to be submitted to Bishop Hughes to that effect.

## ANOTHER DREADNAUGHT LAUNCHED BY BRITAIN

London, Sept. 10.—The battleship St. Vincent, one of the most formidable fighting machines ever designed for the British navy, was successfully launched today from the yards of her builders at Portsmouth. The vessel is of the Dreadnaught class, but includes many improvements adopted after exhaustive experiments with the first of these vessels. In the construction of the St. Vincent the navy has established something of a record for speed in the building of warships, as scarcely eight months has elapsed since the keel for the St. Vincent was laid down at Portsmouth.
