BILL MAIN, FOOTBALL STAR, COMES TO OREGON

San Francisco, Sept. 9.—Bill Main, one of the best preparatory school football players developed in the schools of the Academic Athletic League, passed through the city today on his way to the University of Oregon, where he will commence his college career.

Main graduated from Lick two years ago with the reputation of being a star halfback and tackle, having represented the black and gold for four years. Since that time he has been working in the southern part of the state and recently attempted to enter the University of California, but lacked the entrance requirements. It is likely that "Brick" Mitchell, captain of the Lick football team last year, will follow Main to Oregon.

ALBANY FOOTBALL MEN GET STANFORD COACH

Albany, Sept. 9.—Albany College has engaged O. H. Luck as coach for the coming football season. He is a graduate of the Aurora high school, Aurora, Ill., and of Stanford University, where he was taught the game under Coach Yost, of the famous Michigan team. LILLEY NAMED FOR GOVERNOR OF CONNECTICUT

New Haven, Conn., Sept. 9.—Congressman George L. Lilley, investigator of the famous submarine investigation by congress last winter, was nominated for governor by the Republican state convention here today. The vote stood: Lilley, 402; Lieutenant-Governor E. J. Lake, 133; Governor R. S. Woodruff, 42.

The distinct victory for Lilley is taken as a stamp of approval from the party in the state for his fight in congress, which proved unsuccessful and for which he was severely criticized in many quarters.

In seconding the nomination of Lilley Frank T. Brown said: "There is a more significant indication why an electric boat company hired attorneys all over the country in the congressional districts of members of the naval affairs committee, and of the fact that, when this matter came up in congress, the company passed them all over and hired two New York lawyers. Lilley's prima facie case has never even been attacked."

F. K. Wheeler was nominated for lieutenant-governor this afternoon by acclamation.
