MORE LAND FOR UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

Portland, Sept. 12.—At a meeting of the board of regents of the State University held in this city yesterday a general raise of 25 per cent in the salaries of the faculty from President Campbell down was voted. The most important item of business in addition to this was the approval of the recommendation of the land committee that about 35 more acres of land adjoining the present campus to give the University more room. It is estimated that the additional land will cost about \$30,000.

One of the tracts to be acquired is a small one, only about one acre in extent, known as the E. O. Potter property, but its acquisition is essential, as it controls several streets that otherwise might be opened through the University campus. The option for \$1800 on this property was accepted.

The board voted to purchase a portion of the Gross addition, adjoining the campus on the east. The tract contains 34 acres and the price to be paid is \$18,000. The \$10,000 option on the Kincaid tract, adjoining the University campus on the south, was also accepted.

The following were the additional salaries voted: President P. L. Campbell's salary is raised from \$3,000 per annum to \$4000; Dr. H. D. Sheldon, professor of philosophy and education, from \$1600 to \$2000; Dr. Joseph Shafer, professor of history, from \$1600 to \$2000; O. F. Stafford, professor of chemistry, from \$1600 to \$2000; R. H. Dearborn, professor of electrical and mechanical engineering; E. E. DeCou, professor of mathematics; H. C. Howe, professor of English literature; A. E. Sweetser, professor of biology; W. P. Boynton, professor of physics, each an increase from \$1600 to \$2000 a year. L. H. Johnson, steward and secretary of the University, from \$1800 to \$2000. J. F. Boyard, assistant professor of biology, from \$1200 to \$1400; Percy P. Adams, instructor in civil engineering, raised to \$1400; W. L. Hayward, physical director, from \$1100 to \$1,600; Miss Julia Burgess, instructor in rhetoric, to \$1000; A. W. Jackson, assistant in physics, to \$600; Miss Angeline Williams, assistant in English literature, to \$600; Miss Camille Leach, assistant librarian, to \$1000; C. W. Converse, instructor in electrical and mechanical engineering, to \$1200; A. R. Tiffany, registrar, to \$1400; Dr. H. B. Leonard, instructor in mathematics, to \$1200; Dr. J. H. Gilbert, instructor in political economy, to \$1200; C. A. McClain, instructor in civil engineering, to \$1,100, and C. R. Reid, instructor in mechanical engineering, to \$1100.

For a Girls' Dormitory
 A committee consisting of President Campbell and Regents Ainsworth and Dolph was appointed to investigate the matter of building a girls' dormitory on the Collier property, the committee to report at the January meeting.

The president was authorized to select an instructor in the department of mining to take the place of Professor Terrill, resigned. R. B. Ketchum was employed as assistant professor in the department of engineering at a salary of \$1500 per annum. Samuel C. Elliott was employed as instructor in psychology and public speaking at a salary of \$1000. The sum of \$100 was appropriated to pay for the printing of the Junior Annual. The president was authorized to continue the correspondence school on its present basis.

A resolution was adopted that it be the sense of the board of regents that the Condon cabinet should be owned by the University, and a committee was instructed to report on the matter at the next meeting of the board.

House for Superintendent
 The regents authorized the steward of the University to purchase a small house situated near the University campus for the use and occupancy of the superintendent of grounds, so that he may live right on the campus instead of some other

part of the city.
 The board also voted to accept and take advantage of the "bonding act" relative to the assessment for paving and street improvements on Eleventh street.
 Those present at the meeting were Regents R. S. Bean, president of the board; S. H. Friendly, N. L. Butler, J. C. Ainsworth, F. E. Holman and C. A. Dolph; P. L. Campbell, president of the University, and L. H. Johnson, the secretary of the board.

GOES TO SALEM WITH LANE COUNTY'S EXHIBIT

E. M. Warren went to Salem on the noon train today to place the Lane county exhibit in the pavilion. Romeo Gilbert, the artist, went down on the early train to assist in the work. These two gentlemen arranged the exhibit last year and succeeded in pulling down second prize. They will try hard for first prize this year and every resident of Lane county hopes they will succeed. Mr. Warren has a splendid collection of fruits, grains and grasses, but is short on vegetables. He thinks if the exhibit falls down at all it will be on that account. Vegetables were hard to secure and he has comparatively few samples.
