M. S. HUBBLE PASSES TO GREAT BEYOND

WELL-KNOWN DRAYMAN EXPIRES AFTER EIGHT MONTHS OF SUFFERING—FUNERAL FRIDAY.

M. S. Hubble, the well-known Eugene drayman, after an eight months' illness from tuberculosis of the spine, died at his home on Olive street between West Fifth and West Sixth this morning at one o'clock. The funeral will be held at the residence Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the services to be conducted by Rev. O. C. Wright, pastor of the Baptist church. The Eagles will have charge of the services at the grave in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

Monroe Smith Hubble was born at Stanford, Lincoln county, Kentucky, Dec. 30, 1858. He was united in marriage on his 21st birthday, Dec. 30, 1878, to Moss Emma Moss, of Winchester, Ill. From this union five children were born. They moved to Eugene in the year 1888 and they had been here only nine months when Mrs. Hubble and two sons were drowned in the Willamette river near this city. This occurred on June 30, 1889. On June 24, 1893, Mr. Hubble was united in marriage to Miss Minnie Farrow, of Eugene, who still survives him with his daughters, Mrs. Arthur Merrill, of Spear, Ill., Miss Cecil Hubble and Mrs. James Grant, of Portland.

Deceased was a man of genial disposition and had hosts of friends. He was in the transfer business here for several years until he was taken sick eight months ago and from that time he was never able to work. He underwent three surgical operations during his illness and spent several months in St. Vincent's hospital at Portland, being brought home only a short time ago. He was a member of Eugene Aerie No. 275, Fraternal Order of Eagles, and of the Sons of Veterans.

HUSBAND MADE HER WORK IN FIELDS

MRS. AMANDA HIXSON SUES JACK HIXSON FOR DIVORCE, ALLEGING EXTREME CRUELTY.

Mrs. Amanda Hixson today began suit in the circuit court against her husband, Jack Hixson, for divorce, charging cruel and inhuman treatment. She alleges that at one time he destroyed their marriage certificate by burning it, that at various and numerous times he cursed her and called her vile and indecent names, falsely accused her of being unchaste and unfaithful to him, but the worst of all, so she alleges, that he compelled her to work in the hay and harvest field, while she was in a delicate condition, compelling her to shock hay and bundles of grain and to do other hard work, causing her great physical suffering, impairing her health and endangering her life.

In her complaint Mrs. Hixson says they were married at Roseburg on May 3, 1892, and they have three minor children, William Lester, aged 12; Clifford, aged 9 and Freddy, aged 6. She asks for the custody of the last named. J. C. Johnson is attorney for the plaintiff.
