OREGON WEATHER CONDITIONS FOR THE PAST WEEK

(Bulletin of Oregon, Section of U. S. Weather Bureau.)
The weather during the week was favorable, with mean temperature slightly above normal. In the south-western counties, back from the coast, there was one warm day, when temperature of 100 degrees or more occurred in several places. Elsewhere throughout the state the maximum temperatures were generally below normal degrees. The first part of the week was relatively cool, but no frosts were reported, although the temperatures in some of the plateau counties were dangerously near the frost mark. The opening and closing days were showery, but the amount of rainfall was generally light and the showers fell mostly in the mountains and foothills, and in many of the cultivated valleys none occurred. Snowiness increased during the week, and rain is needed to put out brush fires, which have again become numerous in the forested districts. The sunshine was about normal, and no high winds occurred, the wind movement on the whole being considerably less than usual.

Coast District.
Newport, Lincoln County, Jan. E. Matthews.—The weather during the week was warm and dry, with some fog on the 11th.

Port Oxford, Curry County, E. W. Jensen.—The first part of the week was cloudy, with 24 inches of rain; the latter part was clear and warm.

Willamette Valley.
Portland, Multnomah County, Local Office, Weather Bureau.—Monday was showery and cool. Fair weather, with rather high afternoon temperatures, prevailed during the remainder of the week. Thunder was heard early Sunday morning.

Albany, Linn County, F. M. French.—Cloudy, with light rain on Monday; the rest of the week was clear, with normal temperature.

Corvallis, Benton County, E. P. Erwin.—The first part of the week was cloudy, with light showers. The rest of the week was clear and warm. An early morning fog occurred Saturday.

Southern Oregon.
Drain, Douglas County, Ira Wimberly.—The first part of the week was cool and cloudy, with light showers; the latter part was clear and warm.

PASS CREEK IN FAVOR NEW COUNTY

(Cottage Grove Leader.)
M. C. Stewart, a prominent citizen of Curtin, Pass Creek canyon, was transacting business in Cottage Grove Monday. There is strong sentiment in that part of north Douglas in favor of forming a new county out of north Douglas and south Lane. Those people with their extensive timber interests need road and bridge improvements and they get practically no county aid in this direction. The same may be said of the Divide, Epper Coast Fork, Bohemia mines and Lorane country. The only relief for the neglected sections of Lane and Douglas is the formation of a new county.

Just as the Leader has said many times before, the rapid development of this part of Lane and Douglas counties, their many needs and requirements and their seats, demand the formation of a new county from the northern and southern sections of these two monster counties, with Cottage Grove as the county seat, in which event the interests of Lorane, Pass creek, Coast Fork, Row river and Bohemia would be promptly looked after and the development of this favored section hastened and increased a hundred fold.
