GLOOMY OUTLOOK FOR THEATRICALS

New York, Sept. 18.—For theatrical managers and players the season of 1908-09 is going to be the worst that has been experienced in over a decade. This is the prevailing opinion among the members of the profession and though the season has just begun the prediction is already being borne out by the facts. While the depression that has existed since last fall appears to be lifting for other lines of business there has not appeared as yet any signs of returning prosperity in the theatrical business. Several Broadway shows that were put on for a run only a week ago have closed on account of poor business and the managers are hustling to find attractions that may meet with a greater degree of public favor. Many shows, of course, have started on the road with the opening of the season, but the number of players who have been unable to find engagements is still surprisingly large and it is predicted that before the snow flies the ranks will be increased through the failure of shows that will be unable to weather through the season.

MOSES WILL HOLD OFFICE IN CORVALLIS.

Corvallis, Or., Sept. 17.—The election contest proceedings filed by ex-County Clerk T. T. Vincent has been dismissed and Victor Moses declared elected Clerk of Benton County. The decision was handed down by Judge L. T. Harris Thursday morning. In reaching his conclusion Judge Harris passed upon about 250 ballots, with the results that the majority of Moses was increased from three to ten votes. The trial developed that there was more or less carelessness on the part of the election judges and finally on the part of Clerk Vincent who was custodian of the ballots, but Judge Harris makes it clear that he found no evidence of any ballots having been tampered with.

This case occupied the court's attention fully two weeks about two months ago, and the costs are considerable. These are taxed up against the plaintiff.
