CITY COUNCIL ATTENDED TO MANY BUSINESS MATTERS

An adjourned session of the city council was held last night at which a number of matters were acted upon.

The matter of the injunction suit against the city by J. R. Sellers to restrain the city and the Warren Construction Company from operating the rock quarry at the west end of the bute was brought up and the city attorney directed to look after the city's interests in the matter.

The ordinance permitting the cement sidewalk along the University campus on East Eleventh street six inches above the regular grade was passed.

The plat of the Hill Crest addition to the city was accepted.

The fire and water committee was directed to confer with the water company with instructions to have all three-inch mains on West Eighth street where the pavement is to be laid replaced with four-inch mains.

The application for an advance in the wages of the assistant fire team driver to \$25 per month was referred.

The city engineer was instructed to make a survey and estimate the cost of straightening out the channel of Amazon creek, which is the name of the slough that extends through the southern part of the city. The sum of \$205 has been subscribed by the citizens for the work of draining the land in the vicinity of the creek so that the stream will not overflow every winter.

The petition of the Commercial Club to remove the advertisements from the 12th street bridge and to paint the bridge was granted.

The matter of unsightly signs on and near the depot grounds was referred.

The matter of making a map of the sewers of the city was referred to the sewer committee with power to act.

The matter of printing the argument on the \$500,000 bond issue in the newspapers was referred to the printing committee with power to act.

The contract with Mr. Zergie for improving West Twelfth street from Lawrence to Jefferson street, was referred to the street committee with instructions to report at the next meeting.

The contract for graveling West Twelfth street from Jefferson to Monroe street was awarded to A. C. Mathews. This was later reconsidered and laid on the table for one week.

The matter of Cherry Brothers' closet was referred to the water committee with instructions to report. The street committee was instructed to examine West Twelfth street from Monroe to Van Dyke and to report if it is actually necessary to grade it before graveling.

The mayor announced that he would instruct the marshal to have the wood already cut in Hendricks' park hauled to the city hall for use. The meeting adjourned until next Monday night at 7:30.

FRESHMEN MILDLY HAZED BY SOPHOMORES

UNDER CLASSMEN SUBJECTED TO COURSE OF TREATMENT—MARCHED DOWN TOWN

Hazing in a mild form began at the University last night when fifty or sixty freshmen were rounded up by the sophomores and forced to do stunts, varied and too numerous to mention. The freshmen were first lined up and started down town on a lock-step march, with their trousers rolled up to their knees and with their clothes arranged in other fantastic shapes and ways. The procession was led by a very fresh freshman in a barrel and in that manner the sophs conducted them to the business streets, where they attracted a great deal of attention. The underclassmen were then taken to the baseball park at the south end of Williamette street and mildly but firmly forced to do stunts for the amusement of the sophomores. There was no roughness and no one was hurt. It was a night of fun for the sophs and of surprises and new experiences for the freshmen.

KILLED WOMAN AND BLEW OFF HIS OWN HEAD

Vallejo, Cal., Sept. 22.—Mrs. Henry Mangus, wife of an electrician at the Mare Island navy yard, was shot and killed by Charles Friedberg, who then blew off the top of his head. Infatuation for the woman and jealousy of her husband was the motive. Friedberg roomed with the Mangus family until two weeks ago, when his objectionable conduct caused Mangus to order him from the house. Neighbors say he was a frequent visitor to the house during the absence of Mangus, but it is said, however, that the woman had recently been trying to get rid of Friedberg, and on Sunday he said she had given him until 4 o'clock Tuesday to get out of town. He went to the house again this morning and it is thought attempted to induce the woman to leave town with him. He was drinking heavily, and it is thought the tragedy followed the woman's refusal to accompany him.
