EXCELSIOR FACTORY STARTS UP AGAIN

AFTER AN IDLENESS OF SEVERAL MONTHS' DURATION PLANT IS NOW OPERATING DAY AND NIGHT

The Eugene excelsior factory, one of the city's leading manufacturing institutions, has resumed operations after an idleness of several months' duration, caused by the financial depression. The mill is running night and day with a full crew, having started the first of the present week. The company has orders ahead for excelsior to keep the mill in operation for an indefinite period of time.

This plant employs twelve or fifteen men steadily, besides numerous men in the woods felling the bars, trees and preparing them in the proper lengths for converting them into excelsior. The pay roll is large, hence the resumption of operations will naturally be felt in the community.
