PORTLAND OFFICER  
SHOT AND KILLED  
BY MURDERER

Portland, Sept. 23.—Policeman Samuel S. Young was murdered at 10:30 o'clock tonight in the saloon of W. S. Wood, at East Nineteenth street and Umatilla avenue. The proprietor of the resort was the only other occupant of the place when the crime was committed.  
According to Wood's story the murderer entered the place through the rear door. He wore a white mask over his face. As the door opened Woods says he went toward it to see who was there, and was confronted by the masked man, who brushed Wood aside and, stepping quickly toward Patrolman Young, who was also approaching the door, said:  
"Come on, for this time I have got you."  
The masked man, carrying a revolver in his hand, raised it and leveled it at the officer. While at close range he fired. At the first shot Young turned around and the murderer fired two other shots. One of the three struck the unfortunate policeman in the brain, killing him instantly.
