MANILA PREPARES FOR BATTLESHIP FLEET

Manila, P. I., Sept. 25.—The city is in a fever of excitement over the impending arrival of the American battleship fleet and, in fact, has been so for many weeks, while the extensive preparations for the reception and entertainment of the welcome visitors have been carried on. The arrival of the fleet is only a few days distant and the details of the plans for the reception and entertainment are practically completed. The fleet, coming from Australia, is expected to reach Basilian Island, off Mindanao, next Monday or Tuesday and will probably reach Manila on Thursday of next week.

Everything will be done to make their stay in Manila as pleasant as possible to the men and officers of the American ships. Corregidor Island will have a great "Welcome" sign, visible at a great distance. Arrangements have been made to have a large fleet of inter-island boats meet the fleet at the harbor entrance and to conduct it in to the anchorage. One handsomely decorated boat will contain the fleet committee, the Governor-General and other prominent officials. The Merchants Association and other prominent organizations have also chartered boats and will send large delegations to meet the fleet. The Philippine squadron will, most likely, join the big parade of battleships from the Cavite side.

Among other things a grand water parade has been planned, which will have many attractive features. Women in launches will go in and out between the vessels, carrying flowers. According to program the arrival of the fleet will be the signal for the ringing of all the church bells in the city, the blowing of steam whistles

The American League race of late has made the National look like a procession of heavy trucks.

The record-breaking attendance in New York shows conclusively it is the winning ball team that gets the money.

The Tri-State League closed its season with the same three teams in first position as in 1907, Williamsport, Harrisburg and Lancaster.

September 16 was Error day in the major leagues, 89 wobbles being made. Cincinnati was the only team without a misplay chalked against it.

Nashville recently defeated Little Rock 20 to 1, the largest score registered in the Southern League since 1904, when Atlanta "Jing-whiskered" Shreveport 25 to 5.
