ARGUMENT FOR PROPOSED WATER BONDS

Following is the official bill and argument issued by the city engineer...

AN ARGUMENT

By the Common Council, in favor of the bill for a law amending Sections 108, 109, 112 of the City Charter.

April 18, 1908, at a special election held, the people of the City, by a large majority, voted to amend Sections 108 and 112 of the City Charter so as to grant to the Common Council the power to issue and dispose of negotiable water bonds of the city to an amount not exceeding \$300,000.

At this election in April the people voted for the bonding of the city for the three hundred thousand dollars, and at the same time voted almost unanimously for the purchase of the present water plant belonging to the Willamette Valley Company at the price of \$140,000.

Mr. Kelsey has personally superintended the work and has been careful and painstaking in his effort to reach the actual cost of construction of the contemplated pipe line, and while he has not finished his full detailed estimates, he has for the purpose of this argument, furnished the Council with the following report:

The above estimate does not include the cost of engineering and supervision, and the cost of crossing the Willamette river at Springfield, if the city is unable to get permission to cross on one of the bridges at that point, the additional cost for the Willamette river crossing will be about \$10,000.00.

On August 25, 1908, the flow of the streams being considered for the proposed water supply, was as follows: Ritchie Creek, 2,900,000 gallons per day; Forest Creek, 940,000 gallons per day; Roaring Creek, 284,000 gallons per day; Bradley Creek, 348,000 gallons per day.

If the same quantity of water is daily pumped into the system in connection with the city service reservoir, the cost will be as follows:

At the present time the city has a contract with the Willamette Valley Company to furnish electric power at 1.5¢ per K. W. hour, at the above estimates of Mr. Miller on a 20 basis would be lowered just one eighth of the amount estimated for electrical power.

During the present month of August, for a period of 21 days the record furnished by S. W. Taylor, superintendent in charge of the plant, shows that an average of 1,228,103 gallons per day have been pumped into the system. The greatest amount pumped during any one day being 1,485,000 gallons and the smallest amount 940,000 gallons.

The amendment to Section 109, submitted, is for the reason that advertising for the sale of bonds is expensive, and not always brings satisfactory results. Under the present law if no satisfactory bid is received and the bids rejected, the Council must re-advertise before any bonds can be sold.

Notice to Delinquent Taxpayers

Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised as heretofore; under a law passed by the last legislature of this state...

Section 37 of said law, in part, reads: "Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes charged against real property are delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, penalty and interest, to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property.

To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to settle the same at once. H. L. BOWN, Sheriff and Tax Collector.

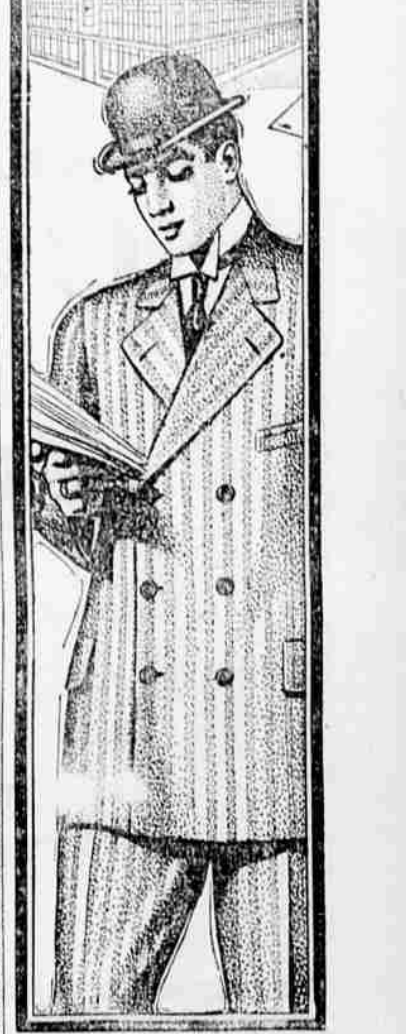
