MAN AND DEER KILL ONE ANOTHER

Roseburg, Sept. 28.—In Ollala canyon, 27 miles west of this city, last Friday, George Buxton, aged 24, son of William Buxton, of Brockway, was killed in a battle with a large buck deer which he had wounded. He was hunting alone at the time, but only a few minutes before he had chatted with in the woods with Geo. Smith, a Portland street car conductor, who was on a vacation. When the two parted Buxton went to the bottom of the canyon and Smith heard him shoot. Supposing Buxton had jumped a deer, Smith felt no concern and returned to Roseburg.

Upon Buxton's failure to return home Smith was sent for and piloted a party of searchers to the place where he had heard the crack of Buxton's rifle. Nearby he found Buxton and the deer together, both dead. The deer had been shot and Buxton's body had been horribly gored by the animal's horns. A knife lying near them indicated that Buxton felled the deer, and supposing it dead, started to cut its throat when it attacked him.
