## STEAMER IS ASHORE ON POINT OF ROCKS

Victoria, Sept. 28.—The steamer Humboldt is ashore on Active Pass. The passengers were taken off by the fishing steamer Edith and are on their way to Seattle. The Humboldt struck in a heavy fog at 1:49 a. m. on Marrott Point, Pender Island, and is hard and fast on the rocks. The tug Lorne and steamer Salvor, of the British Columbia Salvage Company, have left to render assistance.

### Very Old Vessel

Seattle, Sept. 29.—The steamer Humboldt arrived at Seattle Saturday with eighteen survivors of the ill-fated Star of Bengal, and left at 9:20 last night for Skagway, commander Boughman. The Humboldt is an old wooden vessel and has been operated for years without a serious mishap. She is owned by the Humboldt Steamship Company, and is under charter to the Pacific Coast Company. She is equipped with wireless instruments.

### May Yet Be Floated

Seattle, Sept. 29.—The latest advice by wireless are that the Humboldt is resting easily but is hard and fast on the rocks and her forward compartment is full of water. The engines are working to keep the water from the holds and prevent her stern from swinging on the reef. She also has a slight list to starboard. An attempt will be made to get her off at high tide tomorrow, and the passengers may be taken to Port Townsend or Seattle.

## IRRIGATION SYSTEM PLANNED BY CORPORATION

The McKenzie Valley Irrigation and Power Company today filed articles of incorporation with the county clerk. The incorporators are J. A. Youngren, Taylor Needham, H. E. Pnetopoulos and William Platt, and the principal place of business is Springfield. The capital stock is \$5000. The objects of the corporation are to irrigate lands and furnish water power.

Yesterday's Guard noted the filing of a notice of appropriation of 300 cubic feet of the waters of the McKenzie by Mr. Youngren for irrigation purposes. The filing was made for this company, which has just been organized.

According to the articles of incorporation, the territory to be irrigated lies between the McKenzie and Willamette rivers and westward of a point known as Hendricks' Ferry, on the McKenzie.

The main canal will begin at the following described point on the McKenzie: The left, or southerly, bank of the river, which bears south 75 degrees, 37 minutes, east 4391 feet from the northwest corner of section 32, township 17, south of range 1 west. The canal will extend in a general direction by the most desirable route to the Willamette river.

This is one of the largest irrigation projects started in the upper valley since A. R. Black began operations, and the proposed canal and laterals will cover a large area above Springfield.

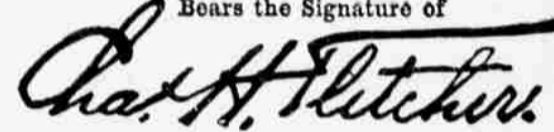
