SAYS HE WILL FENCE UP PART OF JEFFERSON STREET

BANKER HENDRICKS WILL ATTEMPT SETTLEMENT OF STREET MATTER IN COURTS BY SHUTTING OUT TRAFFIC ON HALF OF THOROUGHFARE.

Jefferson street from West Eighth street south several blocks and which separates the Stewart addition from the Huddleston addition, is owned partly by the city and partly by the Stewart heirs, each owning half. Several weeks ago the matter of the purchase of the half owned by the Stewart heirs came up in the city council and was referred to a committee. The committee so far has been unable to come to an agreement with the owners of the other half of the street on account of the price asked for the land being too high, in the judgment of the members of the council. T. G. Hendricks, president of the First National Bank, who is trustee for the Stewart heirs, stated today that if the matter is not settled at once he will place a fence around that portion of the street owned by the heirs to bring the matter into the courts for a settlement. If this is done it will shut out travel along the streets running east and west through the Stewart addition and extending into the Huddleston addition, and in order to reach the latter it will be necessary to go as far north as West Eighth street. As this is now a thickly settled portion of the city, it will mean a great inconvenience, to say the least, for the residents of the Huddleston addition.

LANE HOPS SAID TO BE TAKEN BY HORST

Late this afternoon it was reported that E. Clemens Horst, the big hopgrower and dealer, had during the past few days, since he gave out a very bearish interview regarding the market—purchased practically all the 1908 hops in Lane county, paying 7 1/2c a pound for the best. This news caused a stir in hop circles inasmuch as Mr. Horst had been unusually bearish on the market. The only lots he did not purchase in Lane county, says the report, were those he was unable to get at the price.—Portland Journal.

Notice to Delinquent Taxpayers

Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised as heretofore; under a law passed by the last legislature of this state taxes that are delinquent after the expiration of six months from the first date of such delinquency may be paid by any one demanding to pay same and a certificate of delinquency will be issued to such party.

Section 37 of said law, in part, reads: "Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes charged against real property are delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, penalty and interest, to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property," and section 38 in part reads: "Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of 15 per cent per annum."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property.

To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to settle the same at once.

Notice of Sale of Warrants
