BARN AND TEAM OF HORSES BURN AT SPRINGFIELD

A barn belonging to J. A. Burgess and a team of horses belonging to the mill company were burned at Springfield early this morning. The fire was discovered about 4 o'clock and was beyond control before the firemen could reach it. An effort was made to get the horses out of the blazing barn, but the flames were so thick that no one dared to enter the building. The horses were valued at \$400 or \$500 and the barn was probably worth \$400. The mow was full of hay and some grain was destroyed. Barns belonging to C. W. Ryehard and Mr. Webster, across the alley, caught fire several times and it was with difficulty that they were saved. The origin of the fire is a mystery.

REDISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The school board and superintendent realize that the transfer of pupils which it has been necessary to make will entail some feeling of dissatisfaction on the part of some of the school patrons and it is desired to assure all such that your school officers regret as much as any one the necessity for the changes.

The situation is simply this: By using several rooms in the high school building we shall be able to accommodate all pupils now enrolled but it is necessary to take pupils from both the Patterson and Geary buildings, which are now very much overcrowded, and send them to the high school and Central buildings.

It has been found impossible to arrange the matter by running new ward lines, and so in every instance we have tried to select those to whom the change would work the least hardship, that is, those who would have the least number of additional blocks to walk because of the transfer, and we ask the help and co-operation of the parents in carrying out this solution of what has been a vexatious and perplexing problem.

FINISH UP PRUNE CROP THIS WEEK

The Allen Fruit Company's evaporator in this city will finish up the prune crop this week. Mr. Allen stated this morning that he expected the last prunes to come in today. He stated that the crop in Lane county this fall was smaller than he anticipated, and thinks there is less than half a normal yield. Some growers, whose orchards are in favored localities, raised a full crop, but most of them had yields far below the average. The fruit, however, is of excellent quality and brings \$15 per ton at the evaporator.
