MANY DELEGATES EXPECTED IN 'FRISCO

San Francisco, Cal., Oct. 3. —Everything is in readiness for the opening of the nineteenth annual meeting of the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress, which will begin a five days' session in this city next Tuesday. Those in charge of the local arrangements estimate that there will be more than 1,000 delegates present when Chairman Thomas P. Walsh of the executive committee calls the meeting to order. Among the states from which large

representations are promised are Oregon, Colorado, Texas, Nebraska, North and South Dakota, Montana, Idaho, Washington, California, Oklahoma, Kansas, Minnesota, Arizona, and New Mexico. Iowa, Missouri, Illinois, and a number of states farther east will also send delegates. Among those present will be the governors of several states, together with members of Congress and other men prominent in public life. The congress has chosen for discussion a wide variety of important topics, including river and harbor improvement, irrigation and drainage, Alaska statehood, parcels, post and postal banks, dry farming, trans-Pacific trade, immigration, Hawaii and the Philippines, good roads,

leasing of farm lands, public ownership of utilities, the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition, interstate commerce, and national finance.

SPRINGFIELD

BANK MAKES GOOD SHOWING

The report of the condition of the First National bank of Springfield, published in this issue of the News, should be very gratifying to the stockholders and the many depositors of the institution. Since the last report was made to the state bank examiner on July 15, 1908, the most striking feature of the report shows an increase in deposits of \$24,586.03. This shows a rapid gain over the report that was made May 14, 1908. During the call for the reports between May and July the deposits increased nearly \$9000.

Mrs. S. A. Nickerson, who has been sick for the past three weeks with exophthalmic glaucoma, was taken to the Eugene hospital last Saturday evening, where she could have better treatment at the hands of her physicians. Latest reports are very favorable and that her condition is considerably improved.

The Willamette Valley Company have extended their pipes from Seventh street west to Mill street. Several hydrants have already been put in on the north side, and the Frazer Iron Works at Eugene is getting out several more to be placed where most needed. The city is making some substantial improvements in the line of fire protection.

BEER TRADE IN OREGON STEADILY DECREASING

The Guard yesterday printed a press dispatch from Bellingham, Washington, stating that more beer is used in Oregon than before the "dry" period came on. In contradiction to this is the following by the commercial editor of the Portland Journal:

According to the official figures of the government which were just compiled today, the beer output of Oregon is steadily decreasing. During the months of July, August and September of this year 2071 less barrels of beer were brewed in Oregon than during the same period a year ago. The government figures for the three months show that during 1908 the brew of beer in Oregon reached 62,263 barrels, compared with 65,334 barrels for the same months in 1907. These are small beer making months so the decrease during the flush season is even greater.
