**ATLANTIC FLEET OUTRIDES HURRICANE IN MANILA HARBOR**  
Manila, Oct. 5.—The Atlantic battleship fleet safely outrode a hurricane which swept Manila Bay for 12 hours and did much damage ashore. Typhoon signals were displayed early Sunday morning, but the storm broke over the bay suddenly and unexpectedly at noon. It was impossible to hoist the cutters and launches belonging to the fleet because of the danger of smashing them against the steel sides of the battleships, and the little craft were sent scurrying inside the breakwater into the Pasig river, where they remained all night. The storm quickly increased in intensity and torrential rains shut in the ships.

Washington, Oct. 4.—The itinerary of the return home from Manila of the battleship fleet was announced at the Navy Department yesterday. The fleet will leave Manila December 1, arrive at Colombo December 14, stay there six days, and then depart for Suez, which it is scheduled to reach on January 5.
