THIRD ANNUAL DEEP WATERWAYS CONVENTION

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 6.—All preparations have been completed for the opening here tomorrow of the third annual Lakes-to-the-Gulf Waterways Convention. With 3,000 delegates and over 1,000 speakers expected, and with William H. Taft and William J. Bryan as the principal speakers, the convention promises to be a large influential and highly interesting gathering.

The governors of several states were among the visitors who reached Chicago today to take part in the gathering. It is expected that some eighteen or twenty governors will be on hand when the convention is called to order. From a number of points in the South and Southwest the delegations are coming by special trains.

The convention will remain in session three days. The programs of one or two set addresses each day from authorities of national prominence, including Mr. Taft and Mr. Bryan, will leave the greater part of the time of the session open for the spontaneous action of the convention. Mr. Taft is to speak at the opening session tomorrow and Mr. Bryan is on the program for Thursday. Following the Taft speech tomorrow an excursion is to be run along the Chicago drainage canal to Joliet. Ly-

man E. Conley, engineer of the canal, Isham Randolph, chairman of the Illinois State Waterways Commission and Robert R. McCormick, president of the Chicago sanitary district, will give the lectures enroute, giving information relative to the channel.

On Thursday Mr. Bryan's speech will be followed by one from Clifford Pinchot, chairman of the federal conservation commission. The real business of the convention is reserved for Friday. Officers will be elected and committees will make reports.

The convention will meet in the Auditorium, where the first session will be called to order tomorrow morning by W. W. Kavanaugh, president of the National Lakes-to-the-Gulf Deep Waterways Association, who is also chairman of the Missouri commission, appointed by Governor Folk.

GRONWELL SWORD SOLD AT AUCTION

New York, October 6.—John D. Rockefeller does not care to pose as a collector of antiques. At least this is the conclusion arrived at by the custom authorities at this port, who today put up for sale among a varied assortment of other articles, a sword said to have been worn by Oliver Cromwell and which the Standard Oil magnate could have had by paying the duty on the weapon.

Some months ago the sword was consigned to Mr. Rockefeller by an Englishman, an admirer of Mr. Rockefeller. In a short note attached to the sword the sender said the relic was vouched for as having belonged to the great Commoner, and that only pecuniary reasons influenced her in disposing of an heirloom of such priceless worth. When the sword reached the Custom House Mr Rockefeller was communicated with, but he refused to either accept the sword or pay the accruing duties and as a consequence the weapon was offered for sale at public auction today together with the other unclaimed articles.

MEET TO DISCUSS RAILROAD LOSSES

Washington, D. C., Oct. 6.—The twentieth annual convention of the National Association of Railroad Commissioners began this morning at the rooms of the Interstate Commerce Commission in this city and will continue for several days. The convention is composed of the members of the Interstate Commerce Commission, the railway commission of the various states and other state officers whose duties connect them with the railways.

Among the subjects slated for discussion at the present convention are rates and rate-making legislation, railroad taxes and plans for ascertaining the fair valuation of railroad property, construction and operating expenses of electric railways, grade crossings, amendment of the act to regulate commerce, uniform classification and safety appliances.
