One of the biggest musical offerings of the season will be the appearance of the well-known baritone, Emilio de Gogorza, in concert. Mr. de Gogorza is of Spanish parentage and has his share of the Latin temperament. His voice is wonderfully flexible, and is equally as delightful in the prologue from "Pagliacci" as in that exquisite English song, "Drink to Me Only With Thine Eyes." French, Italian, German and English lends to his programs an unusually versatile quality, and he is recognized throughout the country as the ideal baritone.

In conservative, music-loving Boston, his concert in concert is always looked forward to with great pleasure. The Boston Transcript says: "Mr. de Gogorza is an exceptional singer whose art is an extraordinary blend of technique and genius." His songs are such as they are strong, clear, deep, and warm, with a richness of vocal color and unaffected simplicity making him a most compelling voice.

The final arrangements for the appearance of this great baritone in Eugene have not been completed, as his concert managers, Miss Steers

BASEBALL TRIP ACROSS OCEAN IS PLANNED

A baseball trip to Japan is in store for the University baseball team, if the plans of Captain Hurd and Morgan Watson, the manager, are successful. The University of Washington made the trip during the last summer and won victory. No definite arrangements have yet been made, but as the Orientals seem to be willing to pay good expense money the trip is not beyond the realm of probability.

To insure the success of the project the Northwest championship in baseball should be won next spring from amateur teams of the Northwest. Hurd, at the student rally this morning, said that there is much good material among the new men, and that he believes that the team will be very fast.

At the same meeting Manager McEwen announced that on October 17 as well as the Varsity-Alumni game, a gridiron battle would be fought out between the Portland high school and the freshmen eleven.

Oliver Huston, captain of the track team, also said that there would be a number of cups and medals for cross country work and good training in the track squad. There will be an indoor meet next spring, the Columbia meet, two dual meets, one with the University of Washington in Eugene, and one with O. A. C. at Corvallis, the triangular meet at Seattle, and the amateur meets at the Alaska-Yukon exposition in Seattle.
