## NINE MEN CHOSEN FOR FIRST SQUAD

Nine men were chosen last night by Coach Forbes to be members of the first football squad of the University, and to eat at the training table established today at noon in Otto's grill. Other men will be put on as they demonstrate their ability, until the number reaches sixteen or eighteen. However, the number is not limited, for if players show sufficient stamina and cleverness twenty individuals will be given plates at the training table. At the men on the eating squad are Captain Moulton, Gillis, Newton, Kiltz, Clark, Pinkham, Latourrette, Main, Michel, Coach Forbes and Trainer Hayward. One of the best scrimmages of the season was held last night with the Eugene high school team. The 'varsity' made few attempts to carry the ball, kicking out whenever they recovered it. Time and again the preparatory lads bucked through the line, two or three times for ten yards. Kiltz, the sprinter, is trying for end on the 'varsity' and seems to be doing better than his friends expected. His work has been so consistent that he was placed on the training table. Captain Moulton is being tried out behind the line at full and halfback. Two or three years ago he played a successful game at halfback. "Brick" Michel is also playing half part of the time.

Varsity News Robert Hixon, an engineering student, has returned to college. Registration at the University this morning was 302. Russ Coleman is coaching one of the 'varsity' squads. The enthusiasm among the students is increasing by leaps and bounds. Last night the men of the dormitory held an informal rally among themselves, part of which was devoted to giving lessons in yelling under the tutelage of W. C. Nicholas. The shingles are being laid on the temporary recreation building at the University, the stringers and framework having been completed.
