# CHICAGO CUBS PLAY DETROIT TIGERS TOMORROW

Cincinnati, Oct. 8.—Beginning at 2 p. m. on October 10, the baseball teams of Detroit and Chicago, which have just won the closest recorded contest for the championships of the American and National Leagues, will meet at Detroit to enter upon a six-day series of games for the baseball championship of the world. But one game will be played at Detroit before the scene shifts and Sunday and Monday contests will be played at Chicago, while Tuesday and Wednesday games are to be played at Detroit, and the sixth game, if one is necessary, will then be transferred to Chicago.

### Some Rules Are New

Some additional rules have been adopted governing such contests, although in most respects the rules will be as at previous games. The National Baseball Commission will be in charge, but the immediate control of the games is given to two umpires from each league. For the National League umpires O'Day and Klein were designated by President Pulliam, while President Johnson of the American League, named Sheridan and Connolly to represent his organization.
