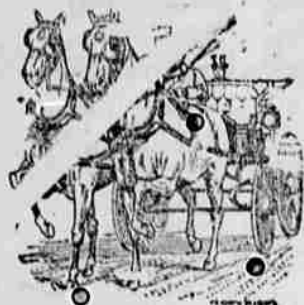

### HONOR MEMORY OF NOAH WEBSTER

New Haven, Conn., Oct. 15.—In the public schools of New Haven special exercises were held today in commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Noah Webster, the great lexicographer who compiled the first American dictionary of the English language. Webster was a native of Connecticut, and a graduate of Yale college. Though his present-day fame rests almost wholly on his dictionary, he was distinguished before he completed that work as the author of spelling books and of legal and constitutional studies. He began work on his dictionary in 1817, and it was more than ten years later when the first edition was published.
