## EUGENE BIBLE UNIVERSITY TO BE DEDICATED

Splendid Stone Building Just  
Completed Will Be For-  
mally Opened

SERVICES WILL BE HELD  
TOMORROW AFTERNOON

Structure Erected at Cost of  
\$35,000 and Over \$40,000  
Has Been Expended in  
Improvements

The splendid new stone building  
of the Eugene Bible University, formerly  
the Divinity School, will be  
dedicated tomorrow afternoon.  
The services to begin at 2:30 o'clock  
in the library room on the second floor  
of the building. Rev. Merritt  
Rose, a former pastor of the First  
Christian church of Eugene, now pastor  
at North Yakima, Wash., will  
conduct the dedication. He has  
been pastor here when the school was  
founded and was for a number of  
years a member of the faculty.  
The building is an entirely com-  
pleted, some work of a minor nature  
yet remaining to be finished on the  
inside, but the institution has occupied  
the building already with a  
number of classes. A report was  
shown through the building yester-  
day by President E. C. Sanderson.  
The workmanship throughout was  
noticed to be the finest and the ar-  
rangement of the rooms is conven-  
ient.  
On the first floor is a large as-  
sembly room 32x40 feet in dimen-  
sions. This is on the east side of  
the building. On the west side are  
two recitation rooms which are  
large and are supplied with plenty  
of light. Besides these there are  
cloak rooms, closets, etc. On the second  
floor there are two recitation  
rooms and the president's office on  
the east side of the building and a  
large library room, 15x30 feet in  
dimensions. The room is large  
enough to accommodate 10,000 vol-  
umes. Also the reading tables and  
other furniture is splendidly light-  
ed. The third floor contains two  
recitation rooms, a large lecture hall  
and room for the school music  
combined, which is 10 feet in di-  
mensions, a society hall, a memorial

hall and a room for the department  
of art. In the memorial hall will be  
displayed portraits of prominent  
friends and donors of the school as  
well as articles of a historical value.  
A number of paintings have already  
been hung in the art room and the  
department is using the new quarters.  
Building Cost \$35,000.  
The building was erected at a cost  
of \$35,000. D. L. Harden was the  
architect, J. A. Nash the stone con-  
tractor and W. C. Heckart had  
charge of the wood work. The school  
is spending over \$40,000 in improve-  
ments, a new brick building for a  
central heating plant being erected  
at a cost of several thousand dollars.  
The heating plant has just been set  
up. It furnishes heat to the old  
school building and President San-  
derson's residence as well as to the  
new stone building.  
The school has 99 regular students  
this year and counting those in all  
departments, the enrollment is over  
100. The institution is in splendid  
condition.
