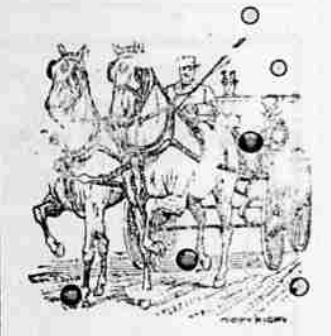

DWELLING HOUSE ON SIUSLAW BURNED

Residence of N. J. Fredrickson Destroyed—Other Notes of Siuslaw Country

The dwelling of J. N. Fredrickson, better known as the Workman house, on the Siuslaw river about three miles above Acme, was burned Wednesday night with all its contents. It is supposed the fire started from a heating stove. Mr. Fredrickson and his partner, Chris Beck, had gone out fishing some time before leaving some fire in the heater, and it is supposed the blaze started from this source. Nobody was near the building at the time. The house was built some ten years ago and cost about \$800 at that time. Dr. E. B. Phelps and family came in from Halsey the first of the week and will remain in Florence. They will reside in Ludwig Christensen's house and he will open a dental office in the building at present used for an office by Colonel Holden. It is a graduate of a dental college in Chicago, and stands well in his profession.

W. R. Dilley and wife, who have been spending several weeks with relatives and friends in Florence and vicinity, left Monday on their way back to Little Falls, Wash. The mill of which he is manager resumed operations this week after being shut down for nearly a year, and it was necessary for him to go back to look after the business. The Hill party of geodetic surveyors came down the river Saturday afternoon, spending a few days on Sweet creek. They left yesterday for the Umqua, where they will finish the work for the season. Roy Hills, a traveling salesman for the Weending Lumber Company, spent several days on the Siuslaw last week. Among other things he examined the oil pressure in North Fork and was very favorably impressed with its indications. Dublin burned home Wednesday after an absence of five weeks at Eugene, and is again carrying Uncle Sam's mail between Mercer and Florence.
