UPPER WILLAMETTE VALLEY WILL EQUAL ROGUE RIVER VALLEY
Resident of Medford Has Faith in Lane County Fruit Land

"Creswell will be the center of a fruit-producing district equal to the Rogue River Valley," says August Moore, who has just purchased the business block of Parsons Brothers at Creswell, and will remove from his former home at Medford to the little Lane county city. The building which Mr. Moore has purchased is the largest in the town, being of brick and two stories high. On the first floor is a large general merchandise store, the postoffice and a real estate office; on the upper the Masonic lodge will hold undertaking parlors.
Mr. Moore located at Medford fourteen years ago. He is a Pacific coast pioneer, now being 81 years old. He took samples of Willamette valley apples back to Medford to show that there are other great fruit districts besides Southern Oregon.

Medford Trades Place
Another deal recently consummated by Creswell through the Willamette Investment Company, of that city, is the trade of the Gilbert McCord place near Creswell, to J. G. Jones, of Colfax, Calif., for the latter's place at Colfax. Mr. Jones will plant 40 acres of his new land to fruit. He is now building a new house.

Water Plant at Creswell
The Parsons Brothers at Creswell are putting in a water system for fire protection on their business portion of the town. Their tanks have a capacity of 20,000 gallons in ten hours and automatically hold the pressure at 100 pounds. The water is taken from a deep well.

Old Creswell News
Henry Hanson, formerly of Ashland, who bought a place at Creswell last spring, has drilled a well 370 feet deep, striking water. It was said it could not be found. The water comes within 20 feet of the surface.

Herman and Frank Schmitt are at Yoncalla selling an imported German Coach station for A. C. Ruby & Co., of Portland, to an association. The consideration is \$2,000.
