PROHIBITION PARTY MAKING ACTIVE CANVASS

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 21.—When the returns of the general election are read two weeks from today the Prohibition party leaders will be mightily surprised as well as disappointed if the figures fail to show great gains for their cause from one end of the country to the other. The campaign that is being directed from the Prohibition National headquarters in this city is by far the most active and extensive in the history of the party. It is an interesting fact that, while the committees of both the Republican and Democratic parties have been handicapped during the present campaign by lack of funds, the Prohibition campaign fund has been as large and perhaps a little larger than in former years. This is easily understood when it is borne in mind that the Prohibitionists and other minor parties well have always had to depend upon contributions from individuals and not from corporations and men of great wealth. At the same time the Prohibition campaign committee declares itself in need of more funds. This is illustrated by the recent statement of Eugene W. Chafin, the candidate for President, that if the Prohibitionists had \$10,000 to spend they could carry the state of Georgia in the presidential election.

The activity of the Prohibitionists in the national campaign has found a reflection in many states and it is predicted that in some of them the Prohibition ticket will carry quite a figure in the result of the election for State officials. The Prohibitionists have named tickets in more than half of the State where state officers are to be elected week after next. GERMAN EMPEROR ON BALKAN TROUBLE

Berlin, Oct. 20.—The Prussian parliament was opened by Emperor William today. Alluding to the Balkan trouble, the emperor said that Germany was less interested there than any other of the powers, but the country was working with the others for a peaceful and satisfactory solution of the present difficulties.

NEWS NOTES.

The banks of Oregon, both state and national, have \$1,000,000 more deposits than they had last July and about \$2,000,000 more than they had last May. This is shown by the statement issued today showing the condition of all state and national banks on September 23, the date for which the last statement was called. The individual deposits amount to \$75,600,000 and the banks are carrying in cash \$12,700,000, or about 16 and two-thirds per cent of the individual deposits.

Enraged by an article which appeared in the Walla Walla Evening Statesman, Friday, L. L. Boise, an electrician, broke all the plate glass windows in the front of that office, valued at \$750. The employees of the Morning Union, published in the same building, heard him and notified the police. Boise made a vicious fight with the police before he could be landed. The story published was that Boise was taking another woman to the fair grounds in a carriage when his wife and five children stopped him, begging him to come home and spend the money on his own family.

Notice to Delinquent Taxpayers

Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised heretofore; under a law passed by the last legislature of this state, taxes due delinquent after the expiration of six months from the first date of such delinquency may be paid by any one desirous to pay same and a certificate of delinquency will be issued to such party. Section 37 of said law, in part, reads: "Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes charged against real property of delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, penalty and interest, to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property," and section 38 in part reads: "Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of 15 per cent per annum."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property. To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to pay the same at once. H. L. BOWN, Sheriff and Tax Collector.
