LANE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL PLAN POPULAR

Many Councils Adopt System—Linn and Marion Already Taking It Up

The "Lane county plan" for country high school organization, which was explained in the September number of the University of Oregon Bulletin, has aroused a great deal of interest toward the organization of county high schools in all parts of Oregon. Requests for Bulletins and information are being received by the University registrar in large numbers. The "plan" is so simple and works so admirably in actual practice that there is little doubt that the number of high schools in the state will be more than doubled within a comparatively short time. It makes possible better high schools in the larger towns and the establishment of others in the country districts where none have existed, obviating the necessity of sending children away from home to school if their education is to continue above the eighth grade. One of its many advantages is that large bodies of valuable land, timber and other, owned by non-residents and corporations, which have always escaped taxation for school purposes, are made to pay their full share. Linn and Marion counties are already taking up the plan, where it is being strongly advocated, and it will be voted on at the November election, and the matter is being strongly talked of in half a dozen other counties.

FORESTRY EXHIBIT FOR SEATTLE EXPOSITION

D. H. Weyant, who Gathered Mineral-Exhibit for Portland Fair, Here Today

D. H. Weyant, proprietor of the Oregon Sienna Paint Company's factory at Salem, which manufactures paint from the material mined at the Simmons paint mine at Walker, Lane county, was in Eugene today. He has been commissioned to gather a forestry exhibit for Oregon, at the Seattle exposition next year. He gathered the state's mineral exhibit for the Portland exposition in 1905, and he made such a success of the work that the Oregon commission of the Seattle fair has employed him to get up an exhibit of the merchantable timber of the state. He is meeting with good success wherever he goes, he said this morning, and expects to secure something above the average from Lane county, as this is reported to be the leading timber county of the state.

North Yakima, Wash., Oct. 21.—When Rev. M. L. Rose, pastor of the North Yakima Christian church, returns from Eugene, Or., where he is assisting at the dedication of the Eugene Bible University building, adjacent to the University of Oregon, he will find that his salary has been increased \$50 a month. This action, which was planned as a surprise, was taken by a full meeting of the congregation, and was unanimous. The congregation has increased so rapidly, consequently increasing the duties of the pastor, that the members of the church believed the minister entitled to more remuneration. They accordingly voted to raise the salary from \$1200 to \$1300 a year.
