MORE PROOF OF D. B. McLEAN'S INNOCENCE

Eugene Man Arrested as Murder Suspect Will Probably Be Released at Once

Facts learned by Sheriff Stevens and his deputy in Portland this morning make it practically a certainty that B. D. McLean, of Eugene, now in custody at Vancouver, Wash., on suspicion of being the assassin of Butterworth, is innocent of the crime. Philip Rosumny, who conducts a pawnshop at 26 North Third street, has informed them that at 9:10 o'clock Tuesday night a man giving the name of B. D. McLean, and answering to the description of the prisoner exactly, was in his shop. The pawnbroker was not "led" by these officers in giving his story, and convinced them he was furnishing nothing but facts.

SEVERAL LARGE REAL ESTATE DEALS MADE

Within the last few days E. J. Frasier, the real estate dealer, closed the following large sales: The A. E. Dean farm of 322 acres on the McKinzie river, to Max Gebauer, late of Texas, for \$6300.
