SATURDAY'S FOOTBALL GAMES BRING OUT NO CONCLUSIONS

Idaho Makes Best Showing of the Northwest Colleges

No surprises were sprung in Northwest football games Saturday. Idaho defeated the Bremerton Navy team 32 to 0, O. A. C. The Dalles Club 19 to 0, and other colleges performed just as expected. Not until next Saturday will anything definite be determined in the race for the Northwest championship.

On paper Idaho appears to have the strongest team in the Northwest. Washington has a slight advantage in early scores over O. A. C. However, Norross did not play his strongest line-up against the University of Puget Sound and The Dalles Club. Oregon's showing against Willamette was an improvement. The backfield men performed creditably, not that further improvement must be made this week, for Idaho, who will be met Saturday, seems to be in her prime.

Oregon's lineup showed an occasional gap, and should be strengthened by more coaching. Frequently the light backs of Willamette plunged through for five or six yards. If the Idaho game was not so critical little need for serious fear need be felt yet. But from the present outlook, as far as the championship is concerned, the game Saturday may be the crucial one of the season. On that account Oregon's team, composed as it is of new men, is seriously handicapped despite of all the skill and wot of the coaches.

Midshipman Davis went to Annapolis from Eugene three years ago, and has since then taken a leading part in the academy activities. He was elected president of his class during his first year there.

After the Harvard-Navy football game he was again honored by being elected president of the Midshipmen's Athletic Association. This is the first instance in the history of the Naval Academy of a class president being selected from among the midshipmen who represent the Northwest at Uncle Sam's big naval school.

FIFTEEN PLAYERS LEAVE FOR IDAHO THURSDAY NOON

Oregon Team Will Try To Win From Fast Idaho Team

The University of Oregon football team leaves Thursday noon for Moscow, Idaho, where the team plays the strong Miners' squad Saturday. Fifteen players will make the trip, accompanied by Coach Forbes, Trainer Hayward and Manager McEwen.

Oregon has not more than four veterans in her line-up, as an average each night, and lack of collegiate experience seems to be her greatest handicap. To beat Idaho, from the present outlook, she must depend on a strong defense and the punting ability of Dudley Clarke.

The weight of her team is about 172 pounds per man, somewhat heavier than the pounds of the Idaho eleven. But from the game Saturday and that against the Alumni, she lacks the snap for which Idaho is so famous. In the last half Saturday the team seemed unable to play fast, being so slow, in fact, that the Willamette men, completely worn out, had them up for downs twice near the goal line. Quarterback Chandler, in the first half, however, got more speed out of the men.

ASTORIA HIGH TO PLAY HERE NEXT FRIDAY

Fishermen Have Heavy Team—If Fast Will Be Problem for Local High

The Eugene high school will play the Astoria high school football team on Kincaid field next Friday afternoon. The Astoria team plays Portland Academy team Tuesday, after which the "salmon sellers" will be the guests of Eugene for the week. The game may be one of the most important of the season from a championship standpoint.

Manager Frank Knox spent this morning making arrangements for the game. The price of the tickets will be 35 cents, the time of the event being at 2:30.

The manager said that the Astoria men were large and heavy, and his opinion were reasonably fast. This being the case, it will tax the local team's speedy backfield to outplay the visitors.

The Salem Excursion

They think that the Salem high game will mean the championship of Western Oregon, and for that reason believe that more than a hundred tickets will be sold.
