BEAN ANNOUNCES FIRST CONTEST IN NEW GAME, LACROSSE

Baseball Men To Be Pitted Against Track Aspirants at the University
 A game of lacrosse has been scheduled among the athletic events of the University some time between Thanksgiving and Christmas. The teams will be representatives of the track men on one side and the baseball aspirants on the other. Manager Bean, who has charge of both sports, today announced the event. Part of the paraphernalia arrived yesterday, and the remainder is expected in a few days. Among these are twenty-four sticks.
 With the shipment were rule books giving a description of the game. The standard field is 125 feet long, but may be reduced to 110 feet. The round rubber ball, about the size of a baseball, but of solid rubber, may be kicked or thrown and caught with sticks. They resemble snowshoes in form. However, the player cannot touch the sphere with his hands, and therefore must both catch and throw the ball with his stick.
 On each team are twelve men. These may block each other in interference. They may carry and run with the ball, so long as they do not touch their hands to the sphere. The object is to toss it through a goal several feet off the ground, one being at each end of the field. In general tactics the game much resembles basketball.
 The benefits derived are particularly valuable in track work. Hayward and Manager Bean believe that it will vary the monotony of cross-country work, yet give as valuable, perhaps more valuable, training.
 The practice field will probably be the old baseball field on the campus, but the game after Thanksgiving will probably be played on the Kucalcid grounds.

KELSAY ENJOINED FROM LAYING WATER MAINS

An order restraining the county court from issuing a franchise to B. S. Kelsay, of Eugene, to lay water and gas pipes in the Arleta district was granted by Presiding Judge Gantwein in the state circuit court yesterday morning. The complainant was J. H. Nash, who laid out the town of Nashville, near Arleta. Mr. Nash says that when he dedicated the streets to public use he reserved the right to lay water mains therein, and the granting of a franchise to Kelsay would be an infringement upon his rights. Notice of the injunction was served upon County Judge Webster yesterday, and also upon Commissioners Lightner and Barnes. The court will take ten days in which to file an answer.—Oregonian.
